## Some other phonetic characteristics

- non-rhotic: no pre-pausal/pre-consonantal
- stop weakening processes are variable, e.g.

intervocalic flapping, "butter, water"
final non-release, "hat, had"
pre-consonantal glottalling, "butler", "not now"

- pre-nasal and pre-lateral vowel effects
