We use **going to** to express our plans/intentions or to make predictions based on what we see.

going to study

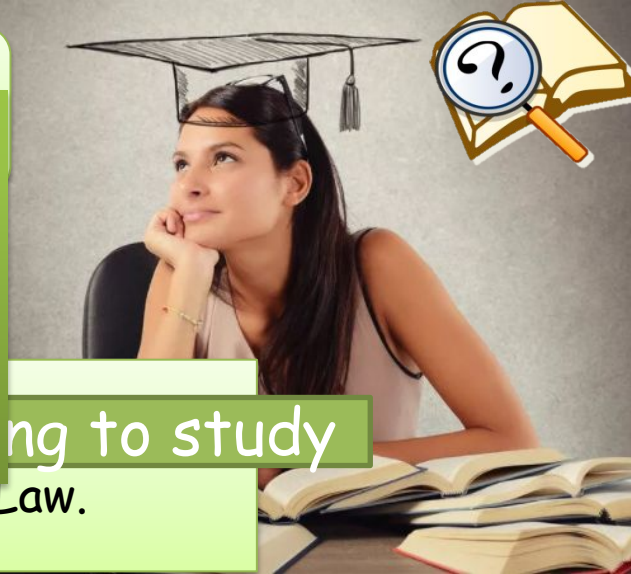
(study) Law.

We use **will** for on-the-spot decisions.
