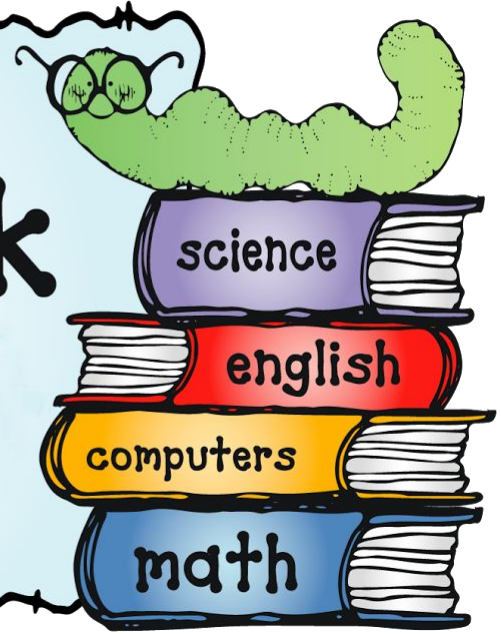

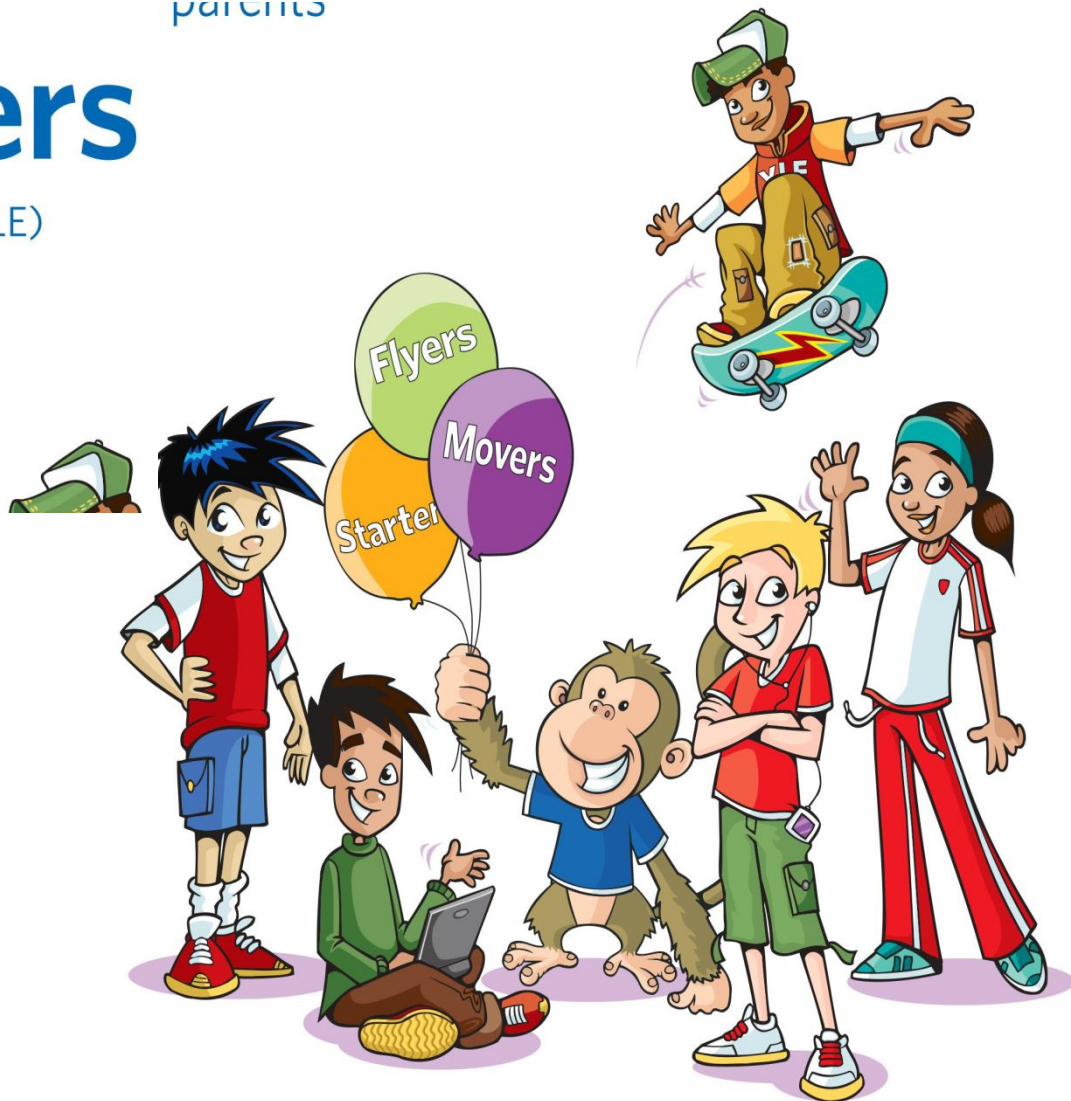

Summary of Procedures

The usher introduces the child to the examiner. The examiner asks how old the child is.

- 1 The examiner asks the child to describe several differences between the two Find the Differences pictures, e.g. 'This is a bird but this is a cat.'
- 2 The examiner tells the child the name of the story and describes the first picture e.g. 'Fred is sad. He can't play football. His ball is very old. His mum's saying, "Take the dog to the park."' The examiner then asks the child to continue telling the story.
- 3 The examiner demonstrates how to do this task with the first set of four odd-one-out pictures and then asks the child to choose one picture in the other three sets and say which is different and why. For example, 'These are all animals, but this is a sweater.'
- 4 The examiner asks questions about the child, e.g. 'Who's the youngest in your family?'

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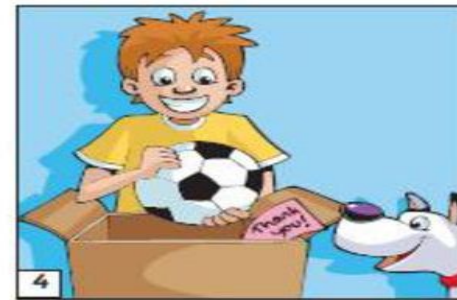
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Key to Procedure Step 2 Possible answers:

Picture 2: Fred and his dog are in the park. The dog's happy. The dog / He's looking at a bag. Fred's angry. Fred doesn't like it.

Picture 3: Fred's mum is talking on the phone. Fred and the dog are listening. They're happy / smiling. Fred's mum has got the phone number of a woman. It's the woman's bag. Fred's mum is phoning to tell the woman about the bag.

Picture 4: Fred is opening a box. There's a new football in the box. It's a present from the woman because Fred found her bag. Fred's very happy!

5. Important things to remember

- At the end of the activity, ask the students the following questions:
 - *How many pictures will you look at in Part 3 of the test? (4 lines of 4 pictures, 16 in total)*
 - *What should you say if you don't understand? (e.g. I don't understand / Can you repeat that, please? / Sorry?)*

This shows good knowledge of English.

- Remind students that:
 - they should take their time to look at the pictures
 - the examiner will describe the differences in the first line of pictures
 - they then have to talk about the 'odd-one-out' in the other 3 lines.
