Mighty Etruscan centre and important mediaeval city after that, Perugia preserves lovingly precious traces of its luminous historical periods. The city, that today is the administrative and cultural capital of the Umbria Region, is one of the major tourist and cultural destination of Italy, site of the University for over than 700 years. The University of Perugia, that is one of the oldest University in Italy and in the world, together with the historical Academy of Fine Arts, the Music Conservatorium and the University for Foreigners, defines the marked international vocation of the city with students coming from all over the world.

How to get to Perugia Perugia is located in the center part of Italy around 160 Km (100 mi) from Rome, principal international airport of Italy, and Florence. Many daily trains connect Perugia with the two cities.

In Perugia is also present an airport whith daily flights from Milan, London or Bruxelles and a train station whith connetcions to all italian cities.
