DIRECT QUESTION		REPORTED QUESTION / INDIRECT QUESTION	
		ask (sb) – спрашивать want to know – хотеть знать inquire – спрашивать, справляться wonder – хотелось бы знать, интересоваться, (ему, ей) интересно	Could / Can / Would you tell me ...? Do you (happen) know ...? Do you remember ...? <i>etc.</i> (see 29) I doubt I don't know / remember I don't have any idea
WH- QUESTION	'Where do you study?' 'What is the matter?'	He asked (me) <i>where</i> I studied. I want to know <i>where</i> you study. She inquired <i>what</i> the matter was. Do you know <i>what</i> the matter is?	
YES/NO- QUESTION	'Do you live in Tomsk?'	He wondered <i>whether</i> I lived in Tomsk. I want to know <i>whether</i> you live in Tomsk.	
OR- QUESTION	'Was he at the lecture or not?'	She asked <i>whether / if</i> he had been at the lecture or not. She asked <i>whether or not</i> he had been at the lecture. I doubt <i>whether / if</i> he was at the lecture or not. I doubt <i>whether or not</i> he was at the lecture.	

YES / NO SHORT ANSWERS

He replied **he did**.

subject + auxiliary verb

He said **he couldn't**.

Yes, I do.

No, I can't.

He agreed.

subject + reporting verb

He disagreed / refused.

Home task
