direct order	reported order
She said, "Eat your food now!"	She told the boy to eat his food right then.

The doctor said: "Don't smoke in here!"	The doctor told them not to smoke in there.

direct order	reported order
The policeman <b>said</b> : "Get out of your car!"	The policeman <b>instructed</b> us to get out of our car.
She <b>said</b> , "You must make the bed before you go to work!"	She <b>told</b> her husband to make the bed before he went to work.

"Get out of the car!" <b>said</b> the policeman.	The policeman <b>ordered</b> him to get out of the car.
"Could you please be quiet," she <b>said</b> .	She <b>asked</b> me to be quiet.
The man with the gun <b>said</b> to us, "Don't move!"	The man with the gun <b>warned</b> us not to move.

**The verb 'said' in orders can be replaced by the verbs with similar meanings**

# Hometask
