The policeman said : "Get out of your car!"	The policeman instructed us to get out of our car.
She said , "You must make the bed before you go to work!"	She told her husband to make the bed before he went to work.

"Get out of the car!" said the policeman.	The policeman ordered him to get out of the car.
"Could you please be quiet," she said .	She asked me to be quiet.
The man with the gun said to us, "Don't move!"	The man with the gun warned us not to move.

The verb 'said' in orders can be replaced by the verbs with similar meanings
