The main rule is that competitors should have fun.

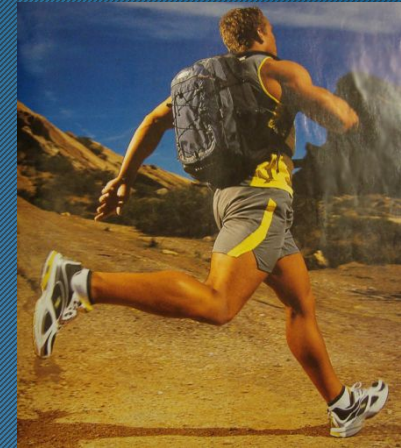
History:
