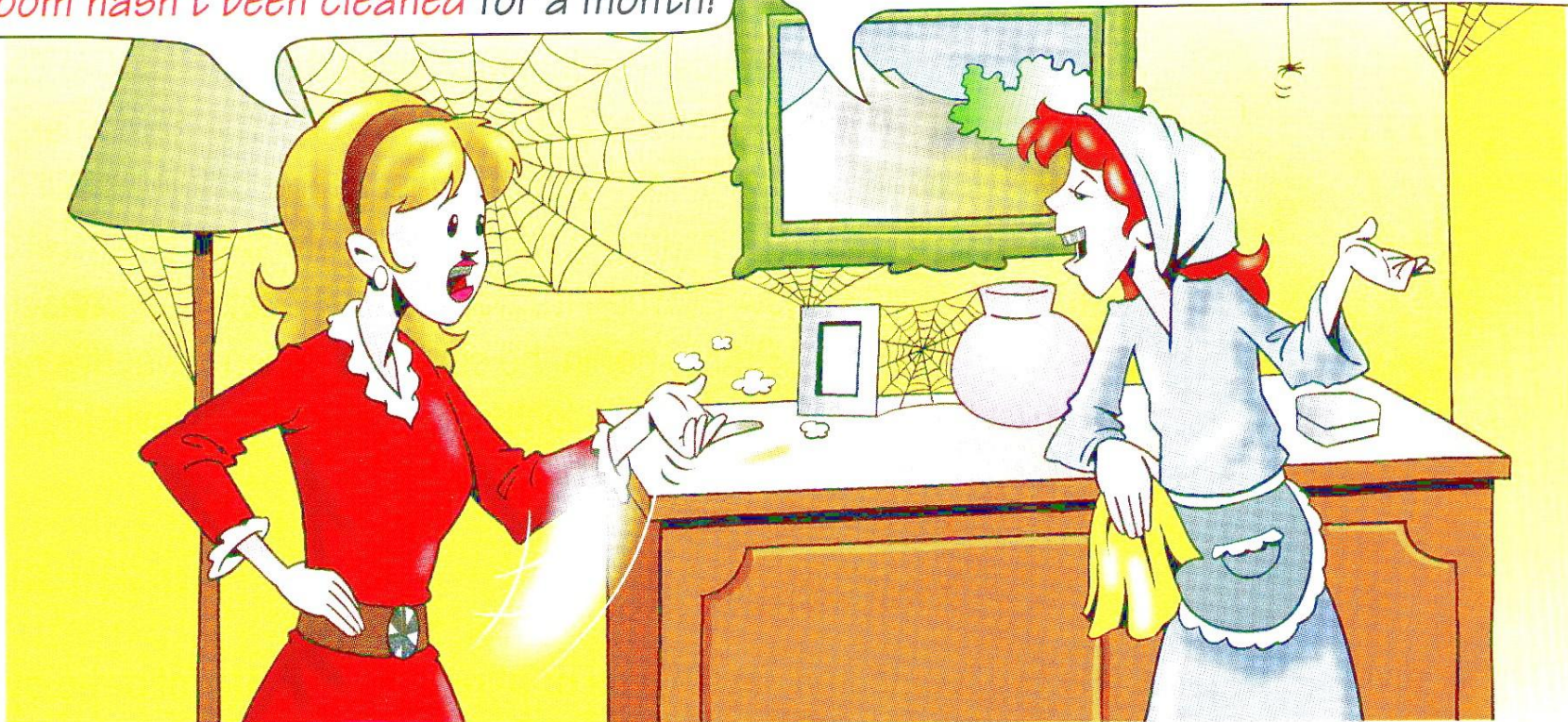
# Grammar

## 'Passive Voice'



Look at all the dust in here! It looks as if *this room hasn't been cleaned* for a month!

Well, don't blame me! *I was* only *hired* a week ago.



The passive is formed with the appropriate tense of the verb **to be + past participle**.



# 'Passive Voice'

	<b>Simple</b>	<b>Continuous</b>	<b>Perfect</b>
<b>Present</b>	am/is/are + V3(ed)	am/is/are + beingV3(ed)	have/has + beenV3(ed)
<b>Past</b>	was/were + V3(ed)	was/were + beingV3(ed)	had + beenV3(ed)
<b>Future</b>	will be + V3(ed)	-	-
