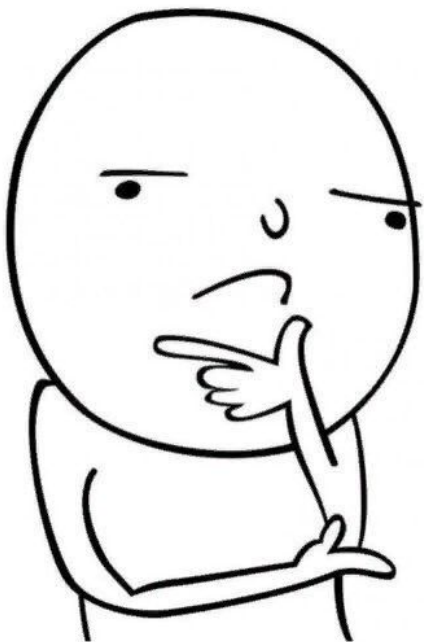

FACT!

the Past Continuous
She was cooking dinner at 6 o'clock
yesterday afternoon.



The Past Continuous

an action in progress at a specific time in the past



Time expressions:

- while
- when
- as
- all day
- yesterday at 5 o'clock, etc.

He was watching TV at 6 o'clock yesterday afternoon.

an action in progress when another action interrupted it



He was cooking when his friend came.



was/were + Ving

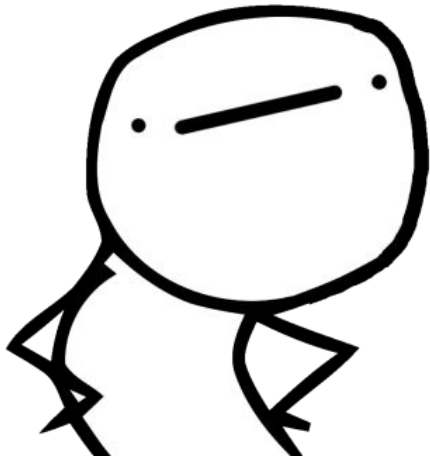

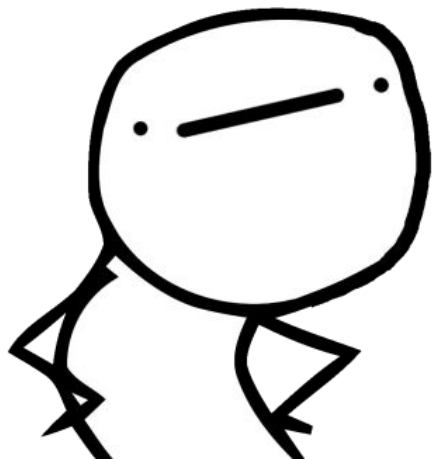
No, she wasn't.

Was John reading a magazine at 6 o'clock?



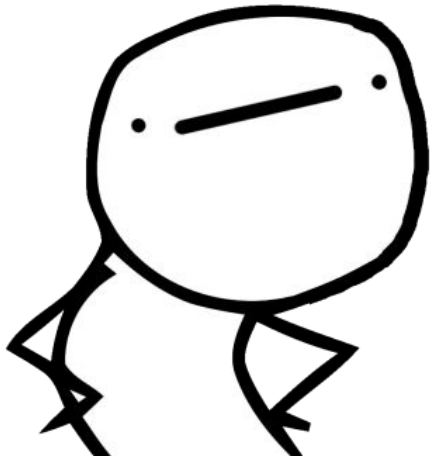
No, he wasn't.

Was Sue sending text messages on her mobile at 6 o'clock?



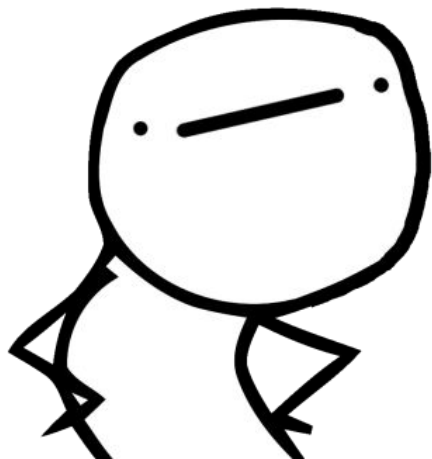
No, she wasn't.

Was Tony sending emails at 6 o'clock?



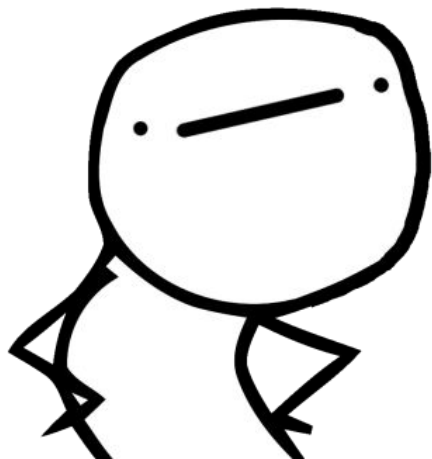
No, he wasn't.
He was reading a newspaper.



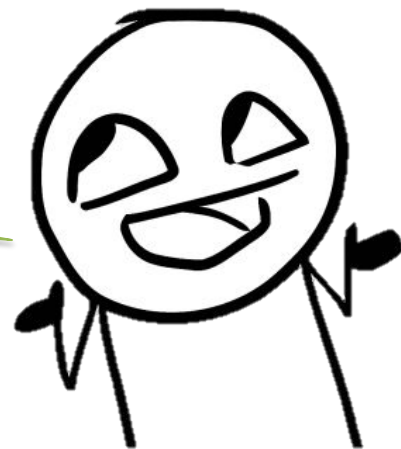


Mary/watch TV/6 o'clock?

She was reading magazines.



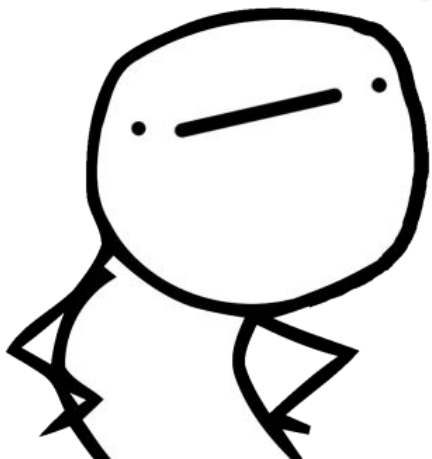

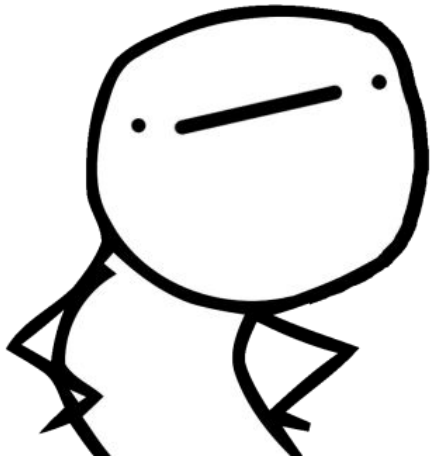

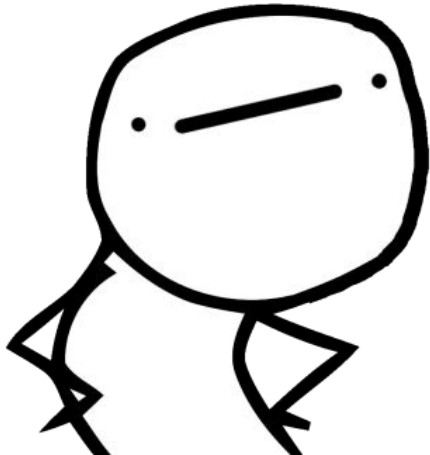

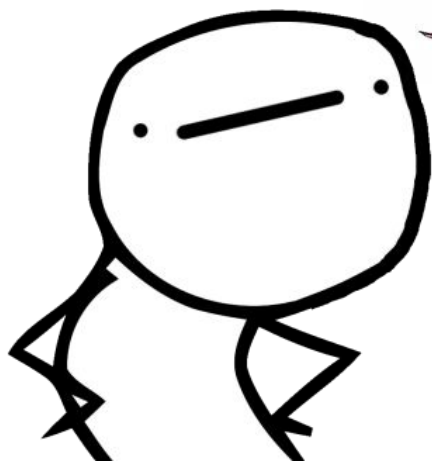

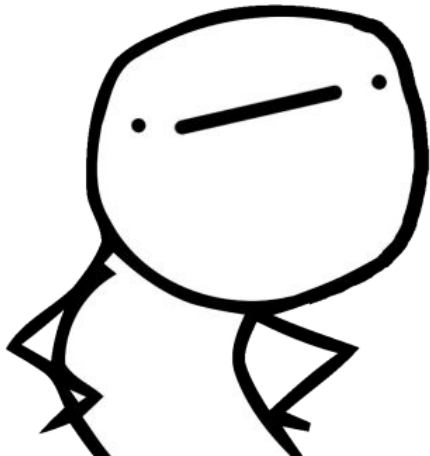
