

Our acquaintance with England began with a port city called Portsmouth, in the centre of which Portsmouth Language College was situated. We studied there for three weeks.






Having arrived to Portsmouth we were met by our host families. We soon made good friends, as all of the members of the families were very talkative, caring

century.











One more beautiful English city in our list was Bath, in Somerset. Bath is the best known for its Roman-built baths. We visited it with our international friends.






