OBLIGATION and PROHIBITION

Must (Obligation): I must do my homework.

Mustn't (Prohibition): You mustn't walk on the grass in the park. It is forbidden.

We use
SHOULD
to give ...



ADVICE:

Should: You should eat healthy food. It's good for you.

Shouldn't: You shouldn't stay up till late. It's bad for you.

HAVE TO and DON'T HAVE TO

We use
HAVE TO
to talk about ...



OBLIGATION

Have to: Police officers have to wear a uniform.

We use
DON'T HAVE TO
to say that something is ...



NOT NECESSARY:

Don't have to: You don't have to pick me up. I'll take a taxi.
