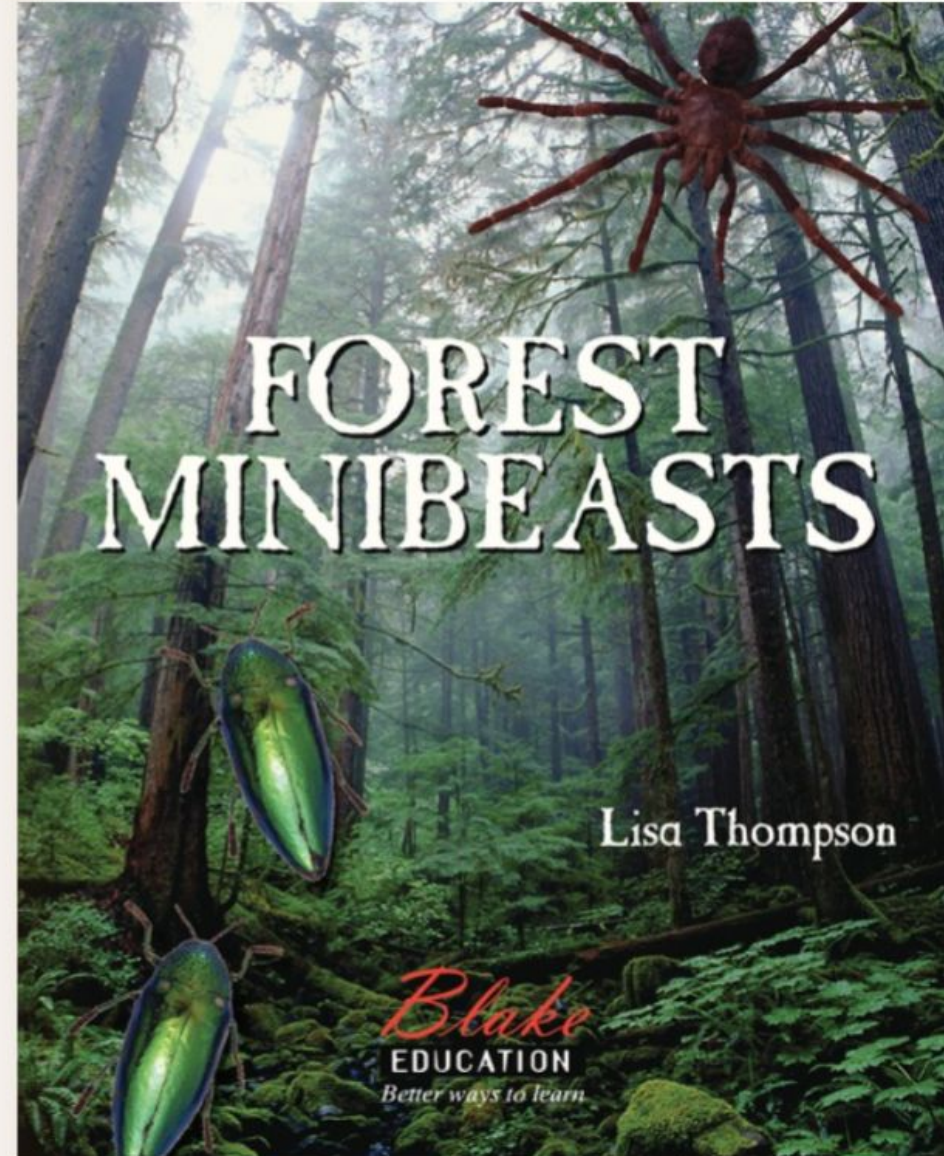

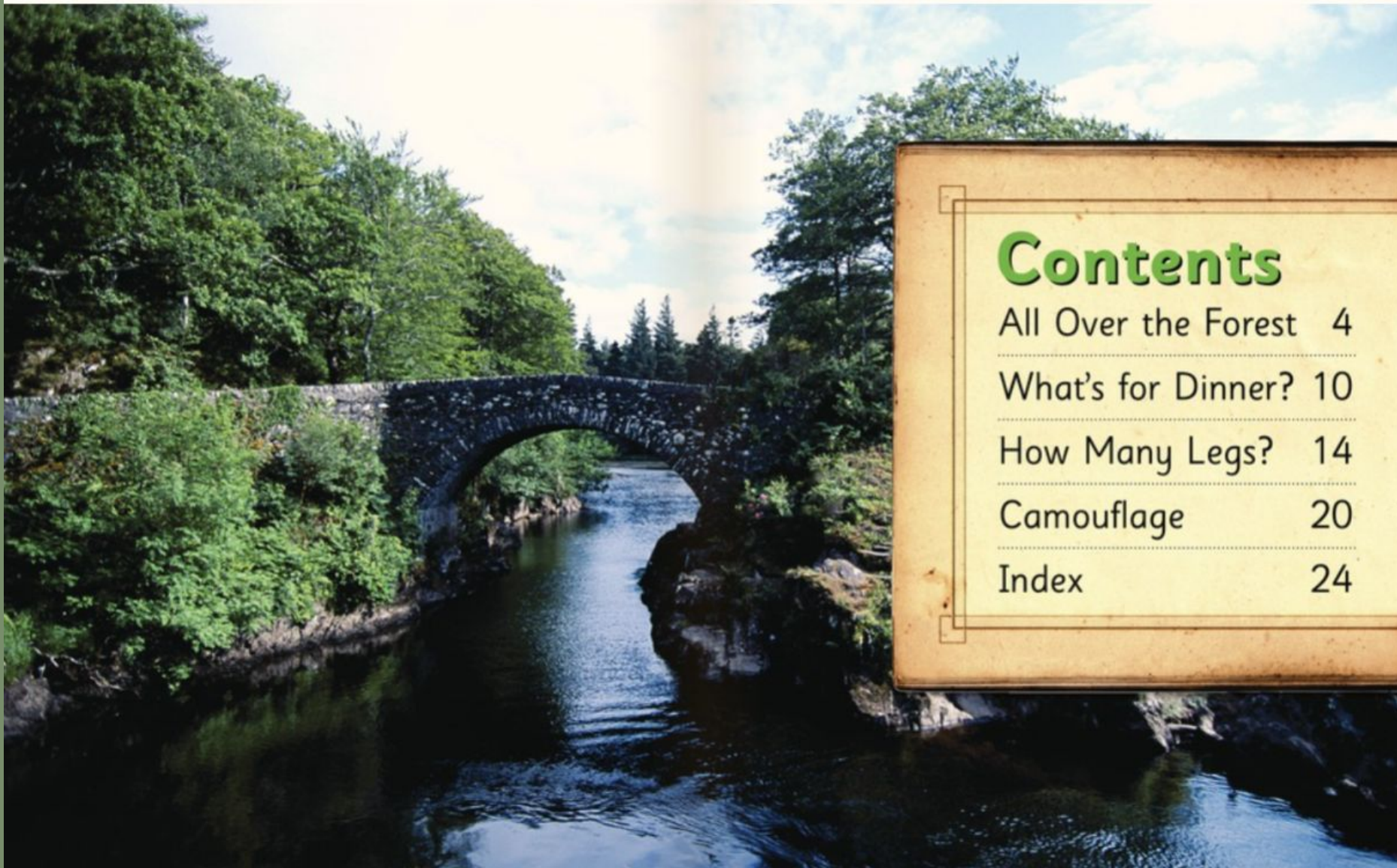

Lots of minibeasts live on the ground.



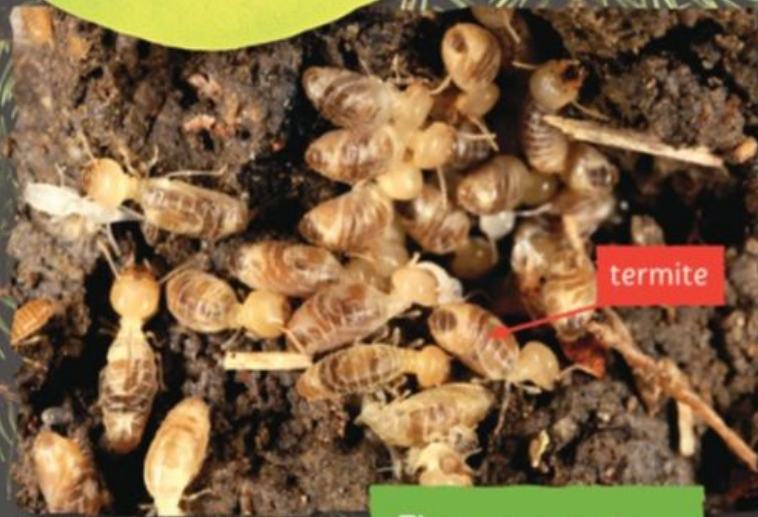
They live on the ground, in the trees and in the air.
