Глагол can обозначает возможность, способность, умение делать что-либо. Глагол can не изменяется по лицам и числам и за ним всегда следует смысловой глагол без частицы to:

I can play the piano.

Я умею (могу) играть на пианино.

He can swim well.

Он может (умеет) хорошо плавать.

+) He can sing.

-) He can't swim.

?) Can he swim?

Yes, he can. No, he can't.

► **Could** – используется в прошедшем времени. (мог, умел)
When Tom was 18, he could speak 3 languages.

+She could speak English last year.

?Could she speak English last year?

+Yes, she could.

-No, she couldn't.

-She couldn't speak English last year.
Could - используется в вежливых просьбах:

Could you give me a pen, please?
