- **garbage** (*n*)-AmE, waste material, such as paper, empty containers, and food thrown away. Garbage is useless.

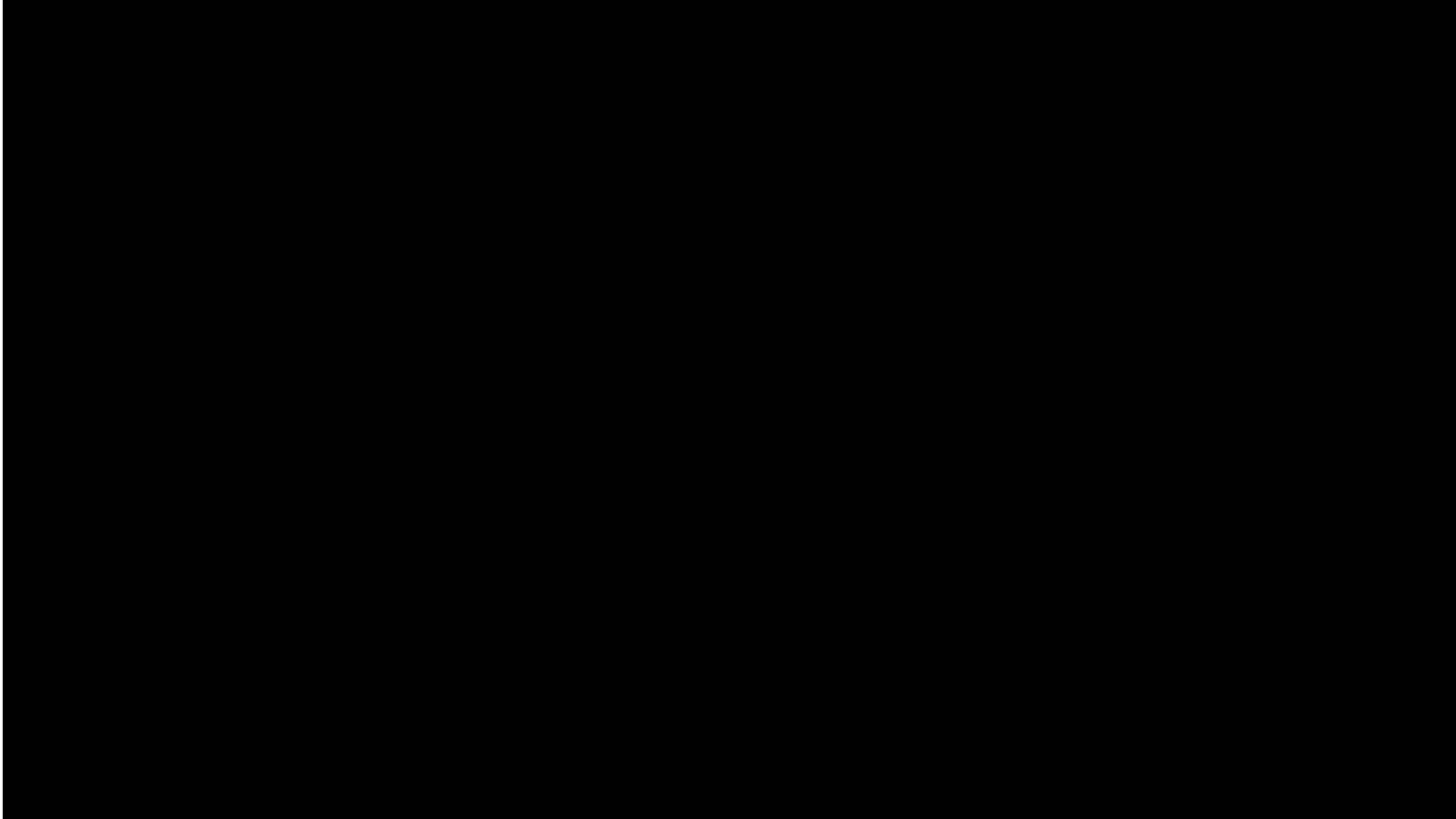
