

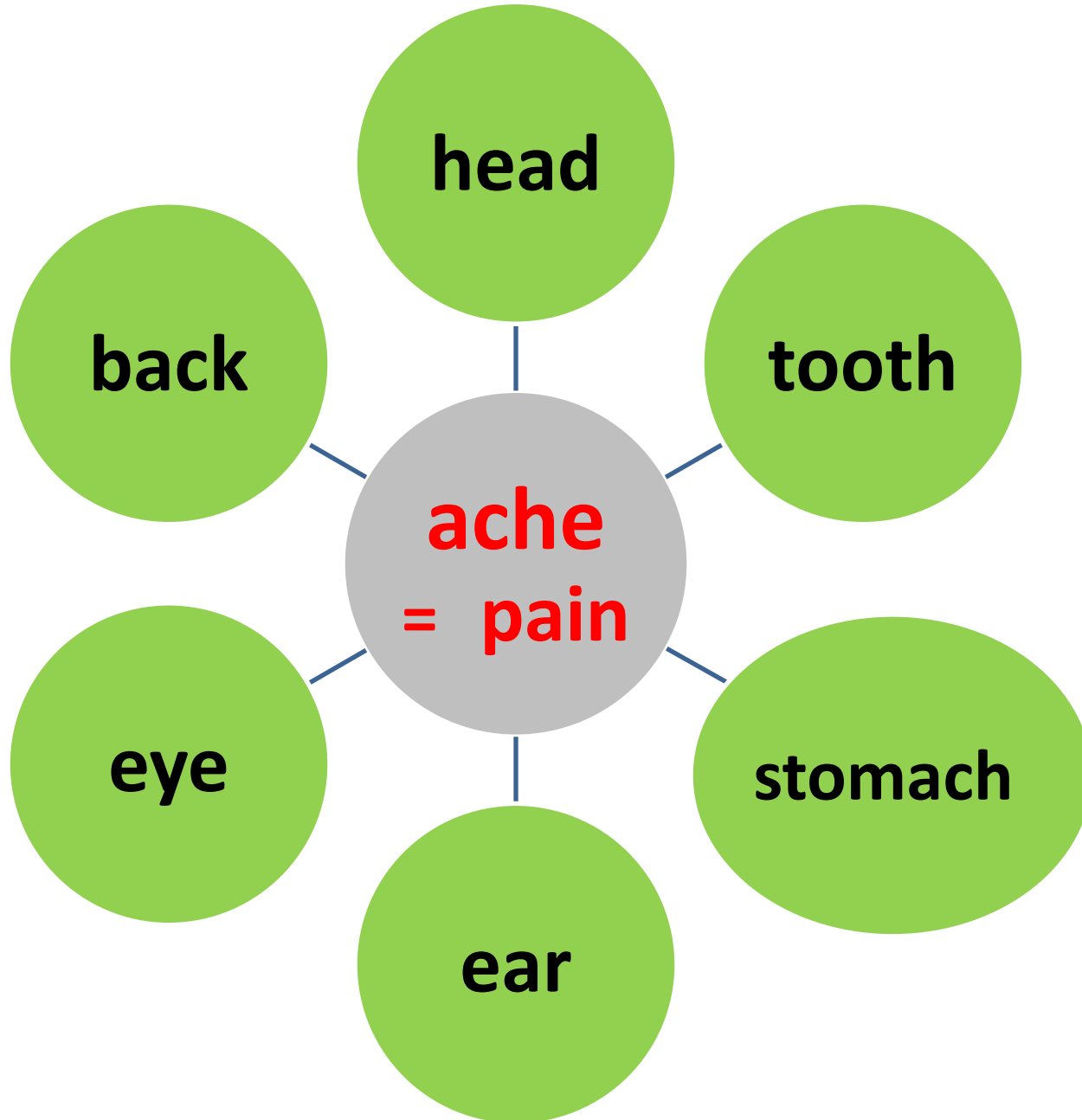
# The theme of the lesson: “A day’s wait”

“Good health is above wealth”

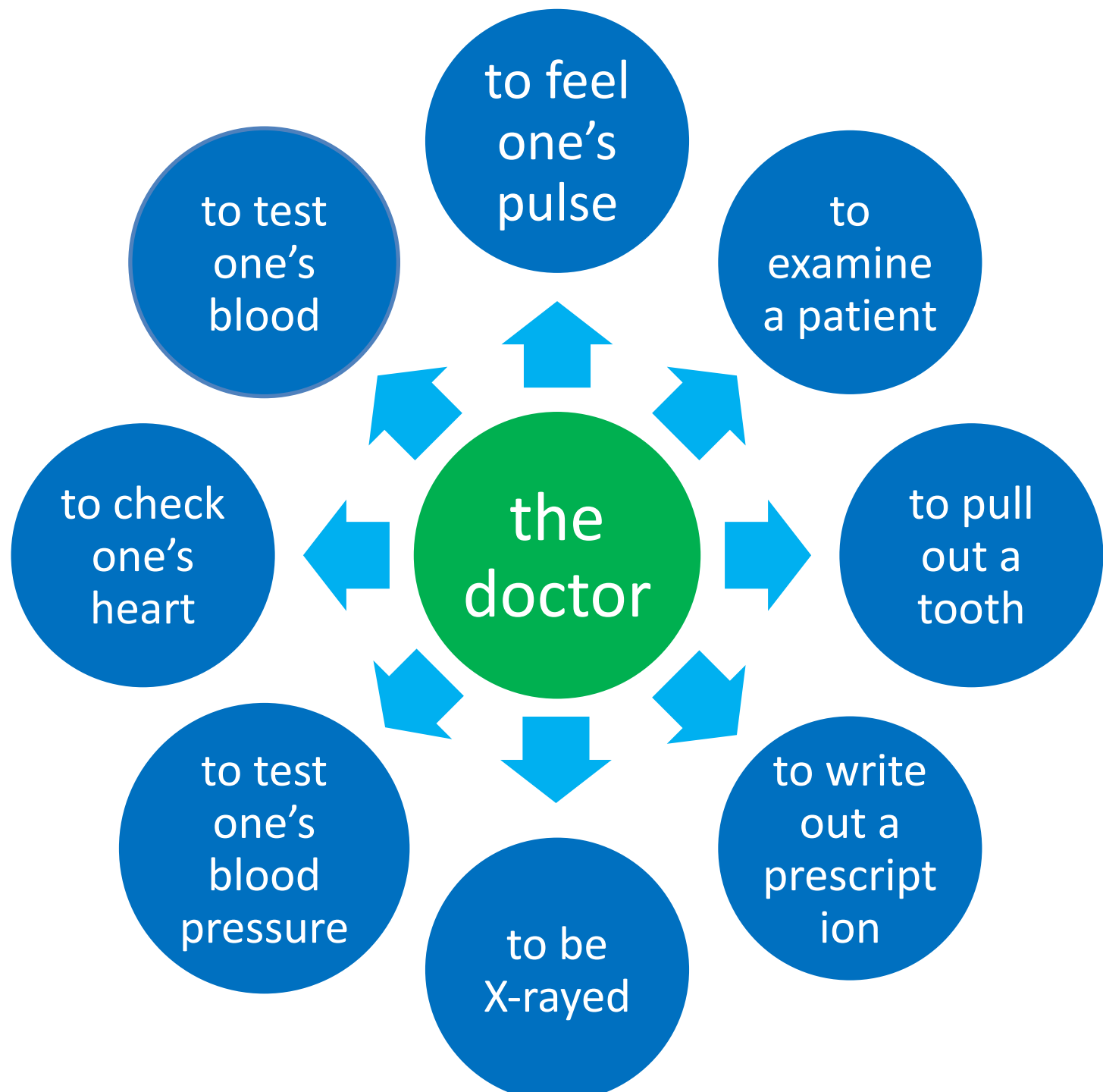
# The types of illnesses

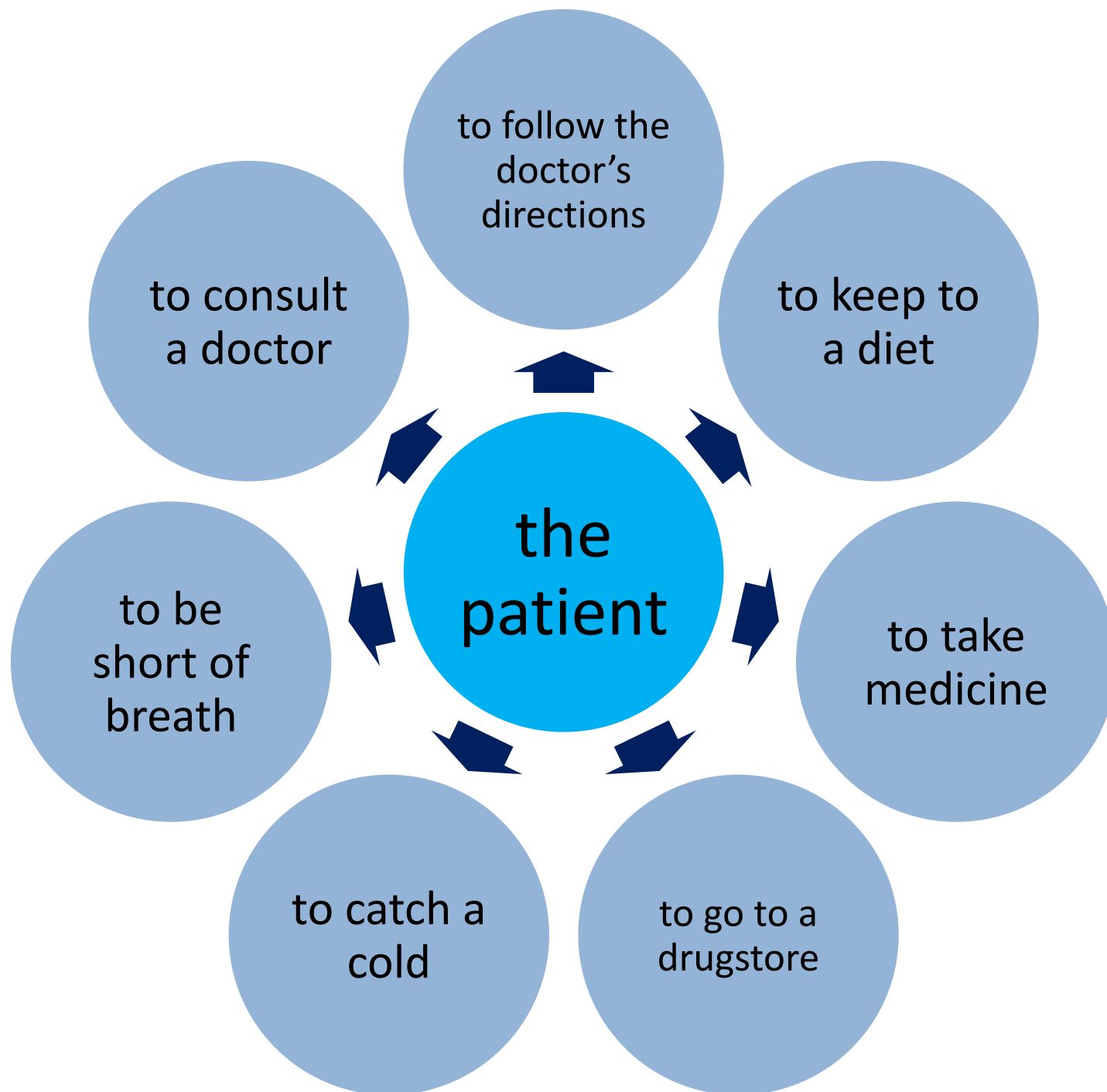


# Let's use word combinations in our speech:

- to be flushed by the fever









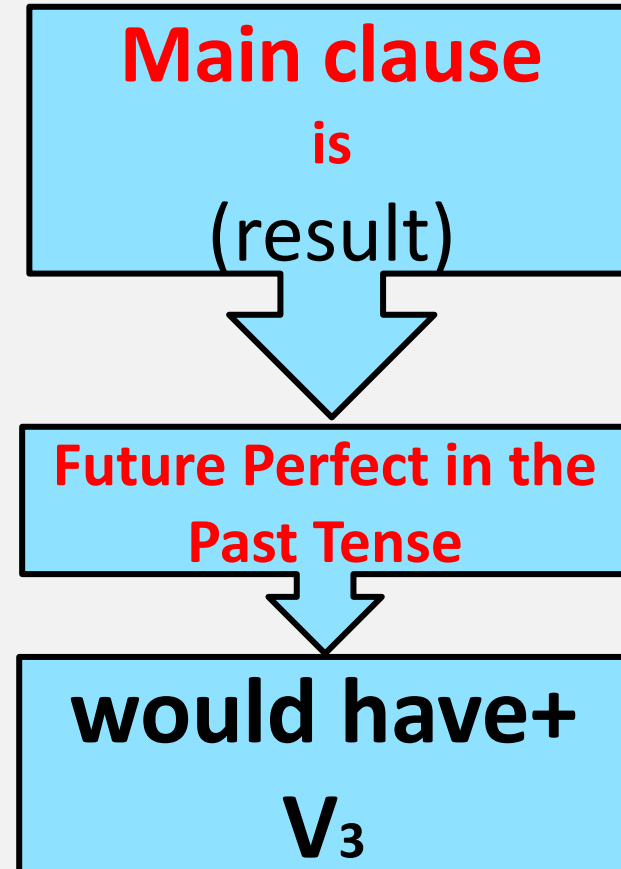
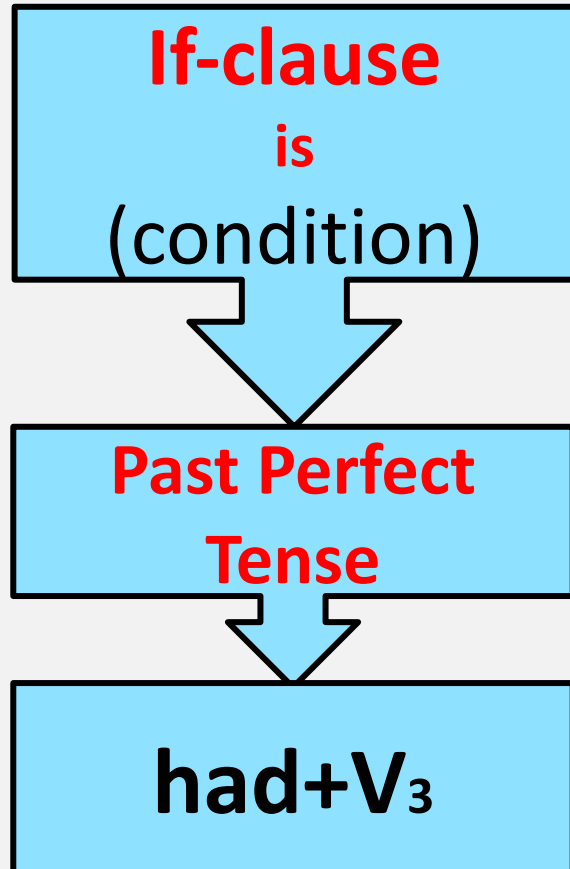
# Conditional 3 = the 3<sup>rd</sup> conditional

a conditional sentence is composed of **2 parts**:

**If-clause**

**Main clause**

**Conditional 3 is used:** to speak about unreal impossible past events



## For example:

If I **had had** enough money, I **would have bought** the camera yesterday.

If **they'd gone** by bus, they **would have arrived** much later.

(They didn't go by bus)

He **would have travelled** around the world if he **had had**

more money.

(Impossible to change, because he didn't have the money)
