- This dress cost me an arm and a leg.



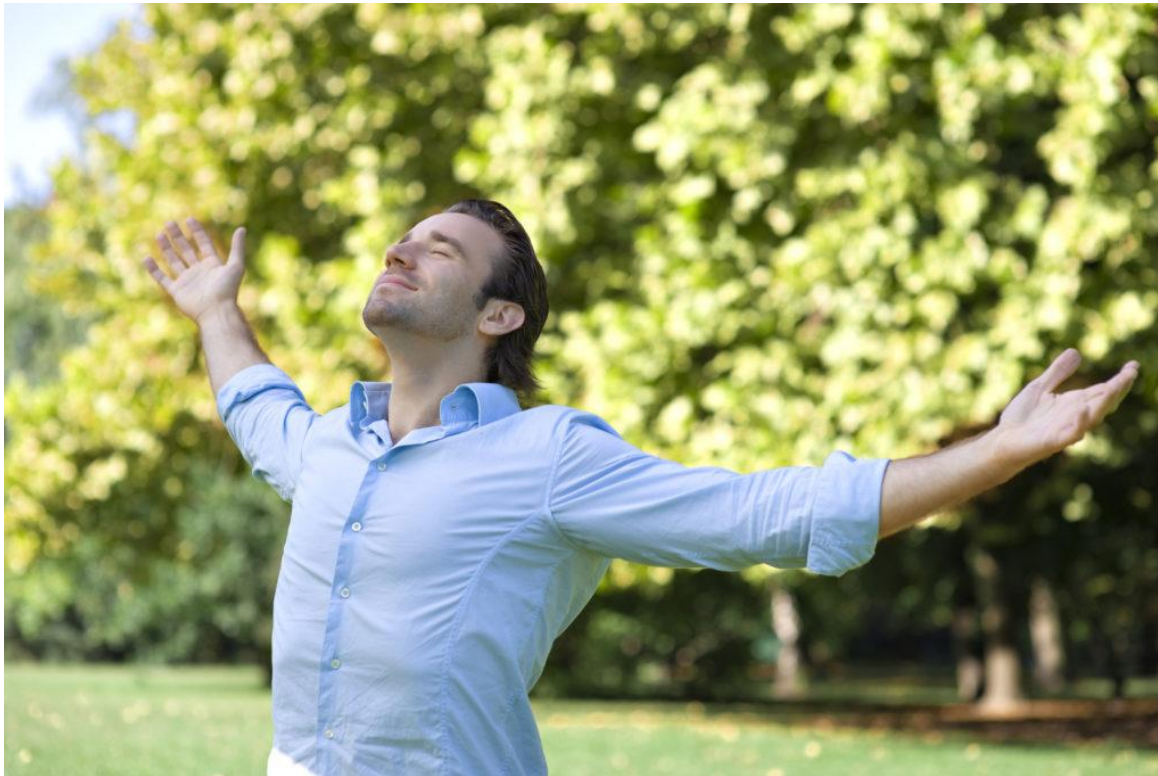
LEARN TO WALK BEFORE YOU RUN

- ◉ She was on cloud nine when he proposed to her.



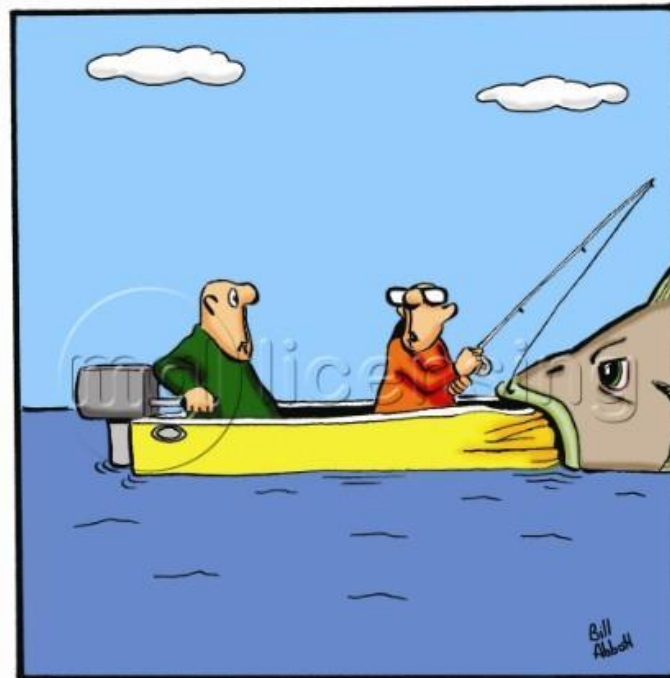



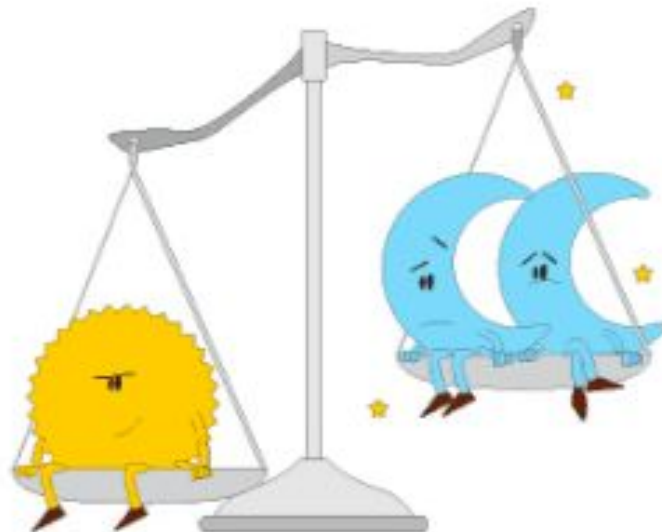
CHICKEN OUT
