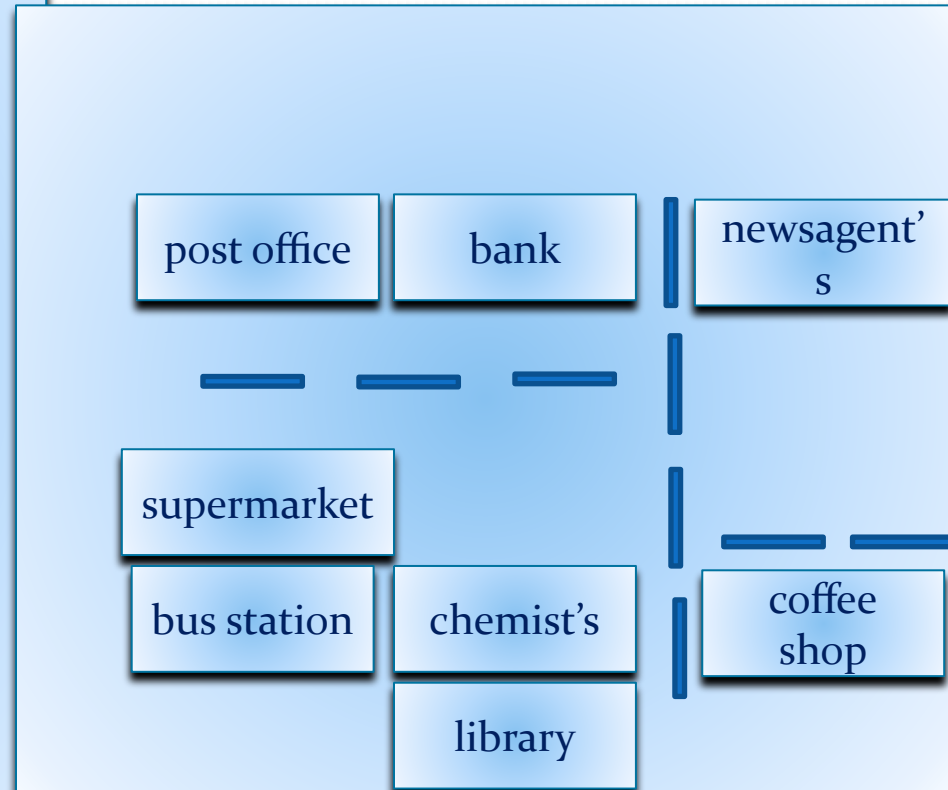


My
