Мы используем **much** и **many** когда говорим о количестве.  
Также можно использовать **a lot of** или **lots of**

*There aren't **many** shops in my town.*

*Do you get **much** homework?*

*I've got **a lot of** games.*

# How to use them?

## Much

+ неисчисляемые  
существительные

I **don't** have much time.  
He **does not** need much money.  
**Does** it use much electricity?

## Many

+ исчисляемые  
существительные

There **aren't** many chair in the room.  
I **don't** have many friends.  
**Do** you think many people will go?



Much и many обычно используются в вопросах и отрицаниях.



# How to use them?

## A lot of

+ неисчисляемые и исчисляемые  
существительные

I need a lot of coffee.  
(= I need lots of coffee)

Maria has a lot of friends.  
(=Maria has lots of friends)

! A lot of (или lots of) используются в **утвердительных предложениях** (с точкой).



## Little/a little

+ неисчисляемые  
существительные

We have little butter left.  
We have a little butter left.

## Few/a few

+ исчисляемые  
существительные

Klee has few friends.  
Klee has a few friends.



# What's the difference between them?

Little

Мало и  
Не достаточно

Few

Мало и  
Не достаточно

A + little

Мало, но  
достаточно

A + few

Мало, но  
достаточно

Пара few – little имеет **негативное** значение: нам не хватит того, что у нас есть.

A few – a little принимает **позитивный** оттенок, нам хватает того, что у нас есть.
