

В большинстве случаев к глаголу в 3-ем лице единственного числа добавляется **-s**, окончание **-es** добавляется после таких окончаний **-ss, -sh, -ch, -x, -o**: scratch – scratches; miss – misses; crash – crashes, teach – teaches, fix – fixes; а также, когда глагол оканчивается на cогласную + **y** = y меняется на **i** + **es** = try - tries; fly – flies; cry – cries;
