Big Ben

Westminster Abbey

Westminster Abbey is a symbol of England. It is one of the most famous and beautiful churches in London. Westminster was built by King Edward in 1065. The coronation of all British Kings and Queens takes place in Westminster Abbey.



Houses of Parliament

The present Houses of Parliament were built after the fire in the Palace of Westminster in 1834. There are two houses in the Parliament: the House of Lords and the House of Commons.



Buckingham Palace

Buckingham Palace is the official London residence of the Queen. The daily ceremony of the Changing of the Guards takes place in its courtyard. The palace was built in 1703 by Duke of Buckingham.



Trafalgar Square

Trafalgar Square is the centre of London. It was named in memory of Admiral Nelson's victory in the battle of Trafalgar in 1805. The tall Nelson's Column stands in the middle of the square.

Tower



Now the Tower is a museum. A lot of ancient traditions are kept in the Tower. For example, changing of the guard and taking care of the ravens in the Tower. The legend says: till the ravens are alive England will be rich.
