- Познакомить учащихся с традициями Америки на примере празднования Дня Благодарения.

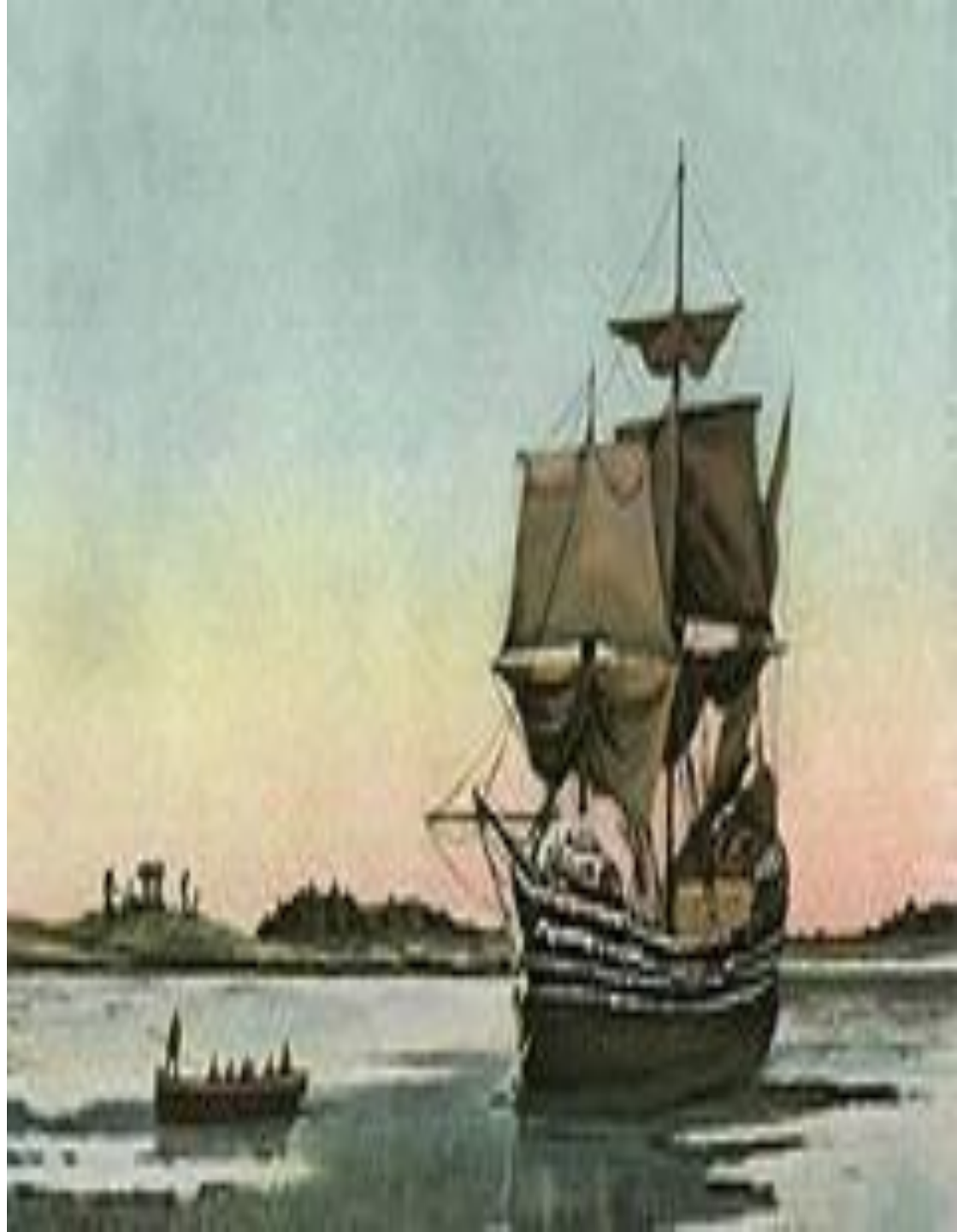
Задачи:

In 1620, a religious community sailed across the Atlantic Ocean to settle in the New World.



**They settled in what is now known as the state :
Massachusetts.**



Their first winter in America was difficult. They arrived too late to grow a rich harvest. Moreover, half the colony died from disease.

After the United States gained independence, Congress recommended one yearly day of Thanksgiving for the whole country. Later, George Washington suggested the date November 26 as Thanksgiving Day.
