Educational system of Russia

The first private schools, gymnasiums and lyceums, have already been founded in Moscow and St. Petersburg, in an attempt to revive the pre-1917 traditionals of Russian educational system with its high standards of excellence. Secondary education is mandatory in Russia.

Children start school at the age of 6 and finish at 17.

There are also “spacial” schools

Stages of Education

- ◎ The first stage of education is elementary school for grades 1 through 4.
- ◎ The second is secondary school for grades 5 through 9.
- ◎ Students are given the choice of either continuing to attend the same school (high school; grades 10 and 11), or entering a vocational school or trade school.
- ◎ Having completed one's secondary education, one can either become part of work force or go on to college (" institution of higher learning ").
- ◎ There are universities and so-called "institutes" in Russian .
