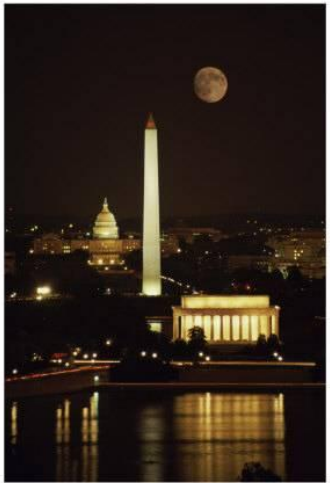

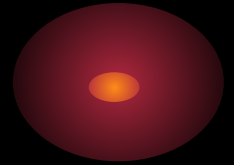
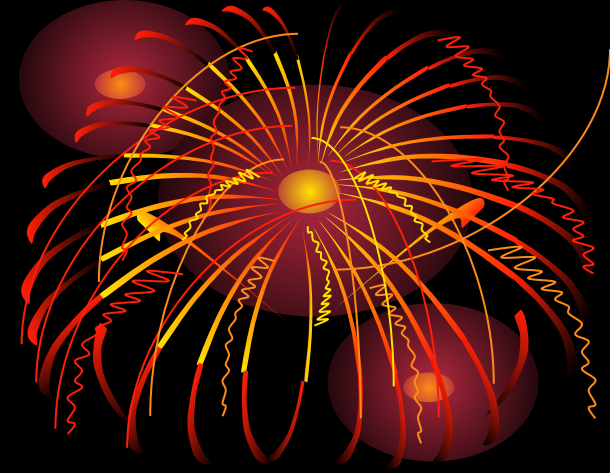

- *The bald eagle was made the national bird of the United States in 1782 . 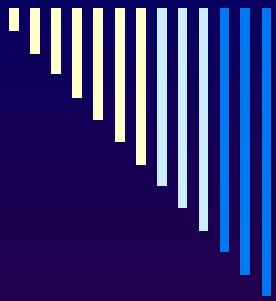
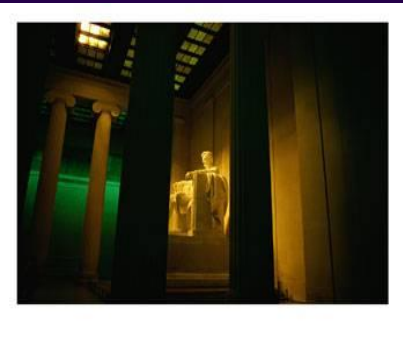
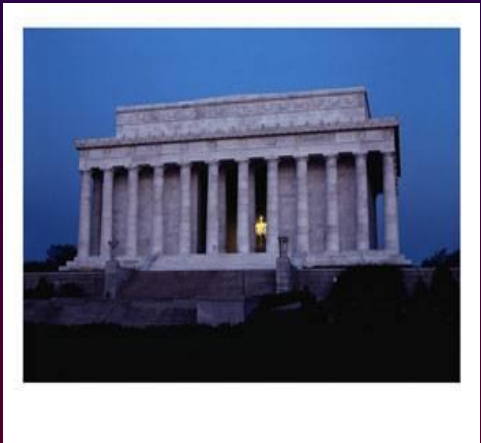
