- religious love

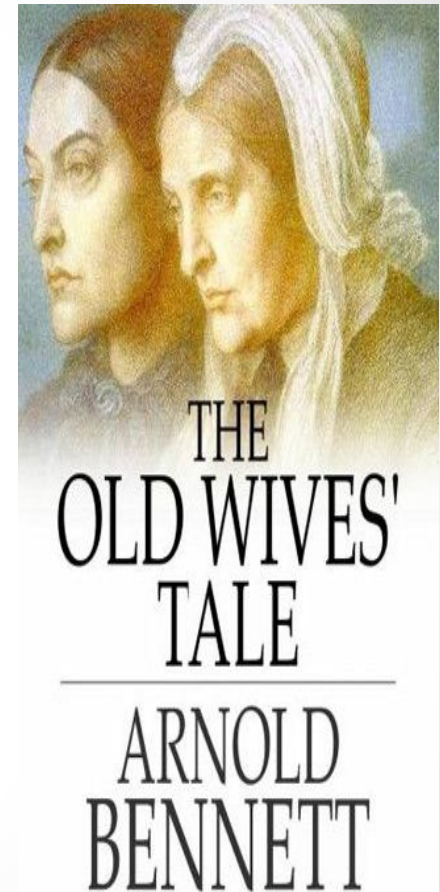
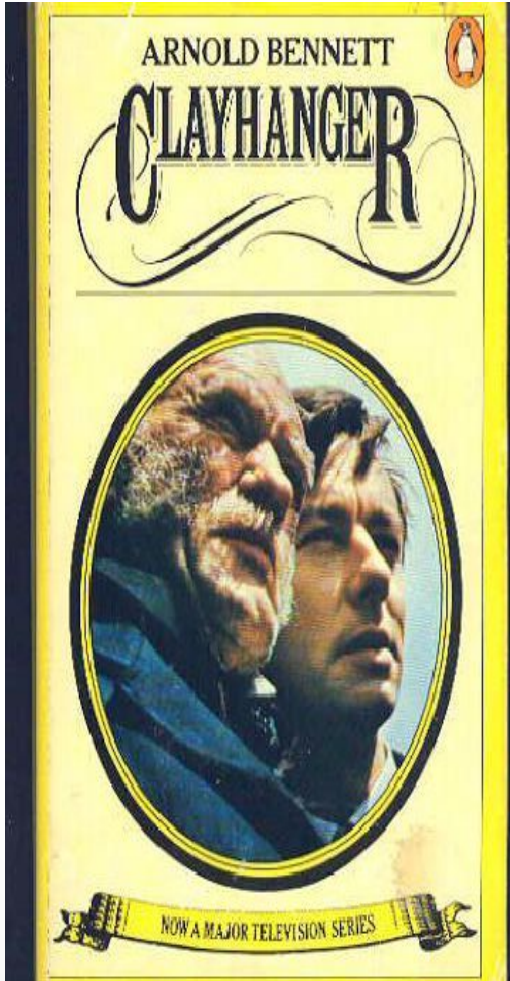
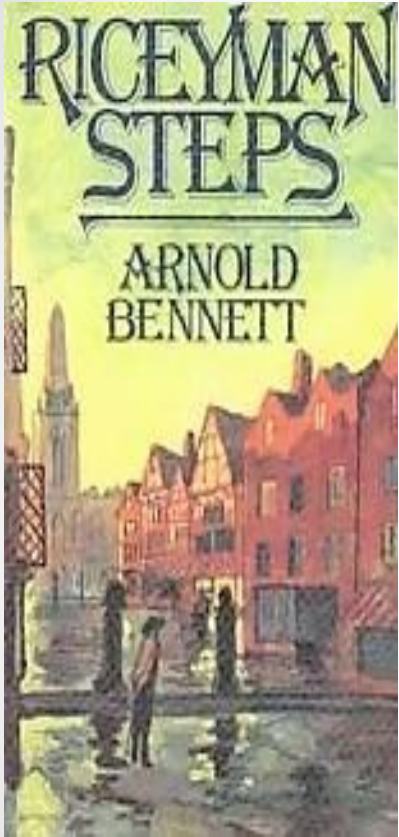


Arnold Bennett
