

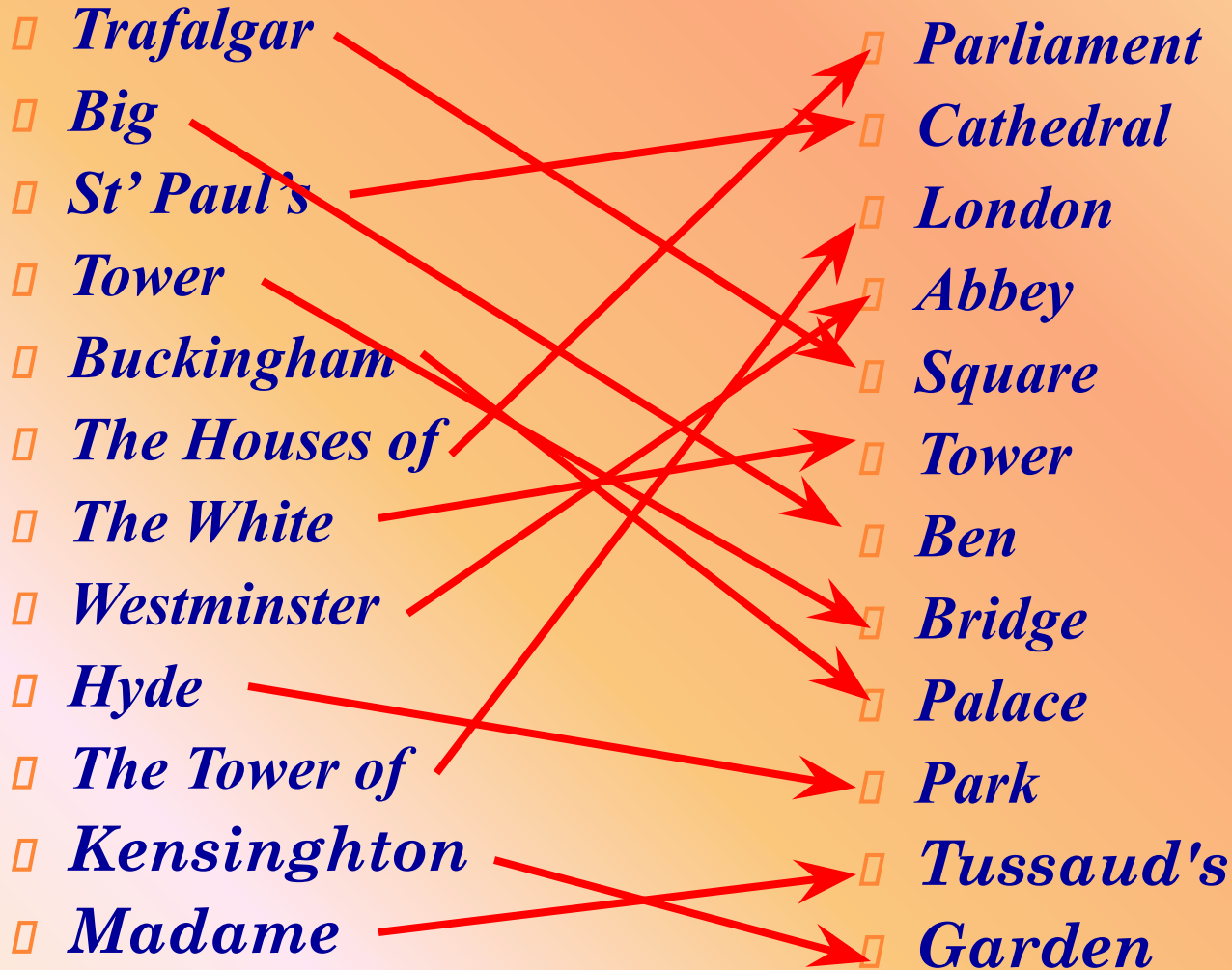

3. It is the great bell in the Clock Tower on the eastern end of the Houses of Parliament in London. It is named after Sir Benjamin Hall, London Commissioner of Works. The booming bell which weighs 13.5 tons first rang out in 1859.

England.***

It was built by King Edward in 1065.

***The coronation of all British kings
and queens takes place here.***

***Some famous English people
are also buried here. Chaucer,
Dickens, Hardy, Kipling are buried
in its famous Poet's Corner.***

5. It is a very big castle.

***It is the oldest place
and the most famous of all historical
buildings in London. It has a long and
cruel history. It was a castle, a palace,
a zoo and a prison but it is only a
museum now. The most famous things
kept here are the Crown Jewels.***

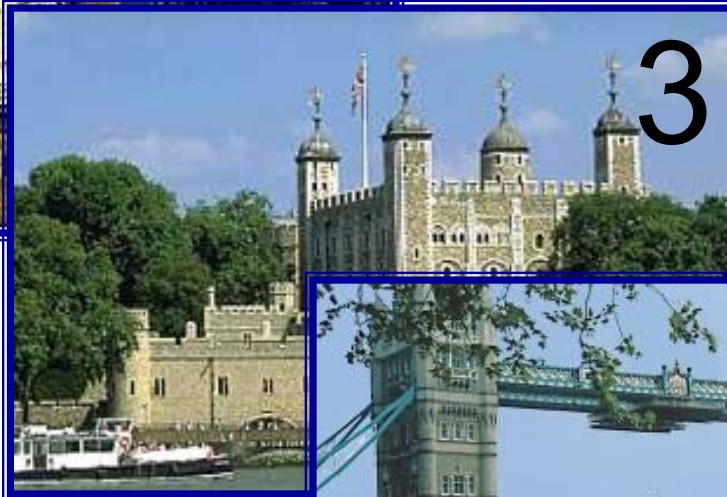
