


Coat of Arms

The government of the Netherlands normally uses the coat of arms without the mantle or even just a crowned shield. At the billboard there is a lion with the sword and a bunch of seven arrows. Arrows mean seven provinces of Utrecht. The crown is the symbol of the monarchy. The words on the bottom are translated as "I bear"



Geographical Position of the Netherlands on the Map of Europe

Since the Roman Empire, the Dutch wrested the land from the sea. The first polders appeared in the XIII century, and since then along the coast a large area was drained. Major reclamation projects were implemented in 1930-1950s. Then it was created an artificial lake Isselmeer which became the largest in the Western Europe (on the place of the dry bay was formed the 12-th Netherlands' province Flevoland). These lands are very fertile. That's why agriculture in the Netherlands is developed very much. Agricultural lands occupy 65% of the country: crops, live-stock, horticulture, greenhouses.

The Netherlands is a maritime country. That's why there are a lot of windmills and fisheries there.



Due to the fact that the Netherlands had developed great floriculture a tulip became the national symbol of the country.



The Netherlands are situated in Europe. So it is a technologically developed country. But an ecological bike became the national symbol of the country.
