Rudyard Kipling (1865-1936)



*He was a British author and poet. Born in Bombay, British India (now Mumbai), he is best known for his works of fiction *The Jungle Book* (1894) (a collection of stories which includes *Rikki-Tikki-Tavi*), *Kim* (1901) (a tale of adventure), many short stories, including *The Man Who Would Be King* (1888); and his poems, including *Mandalay* (1890), *Gunga Din* (1890), and *If—* (1910). He is regarded as a major "innovator in the art of the short story"; his children's books are enduring classics of children's literature.*



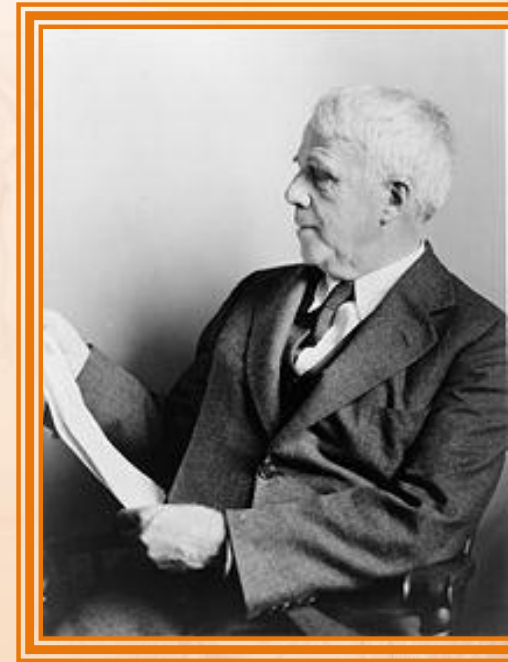

He was an American poet and playwright. He is highly regarded for his realistic depictions of rural life. A popular and often-quoted poet, Frost was honored frequently during his lifetime, receiving four Pulitzer Prizes for Poetry.

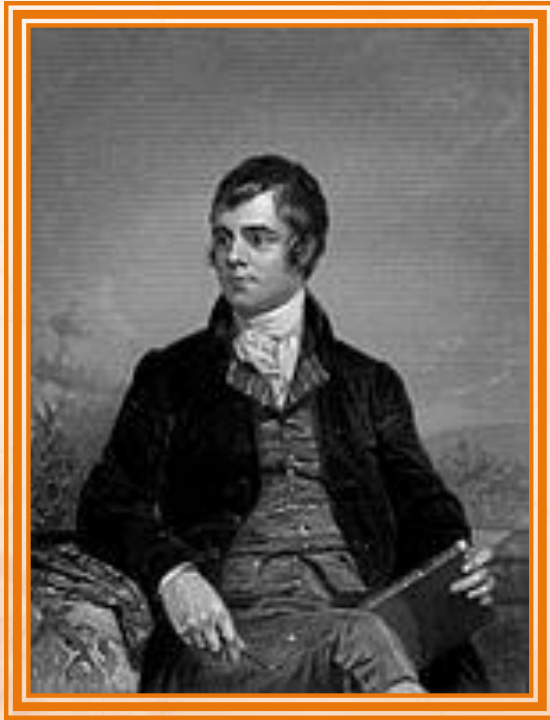

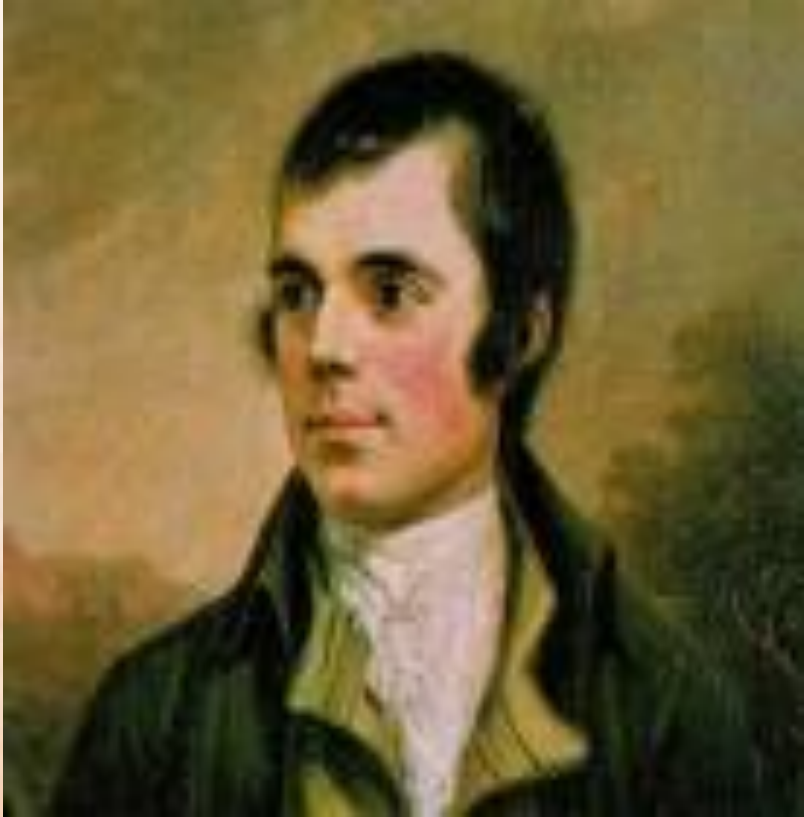
Robert Burns (1759-1796)



He was a Scottish poet and a lyricist. He is widely regarded as the national poet of Scotland, and is celebrated worldwide. He is regarded as a pioneer of the Romantic movement and after his death became a great source of inspiration to the founders of both liberalism and socialism.

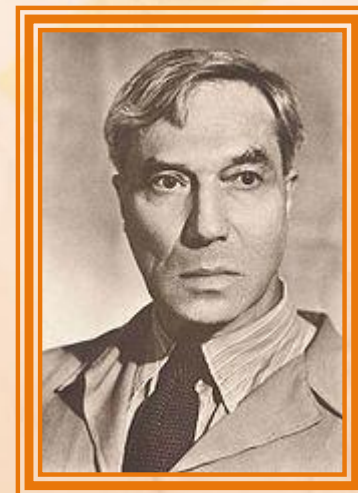
