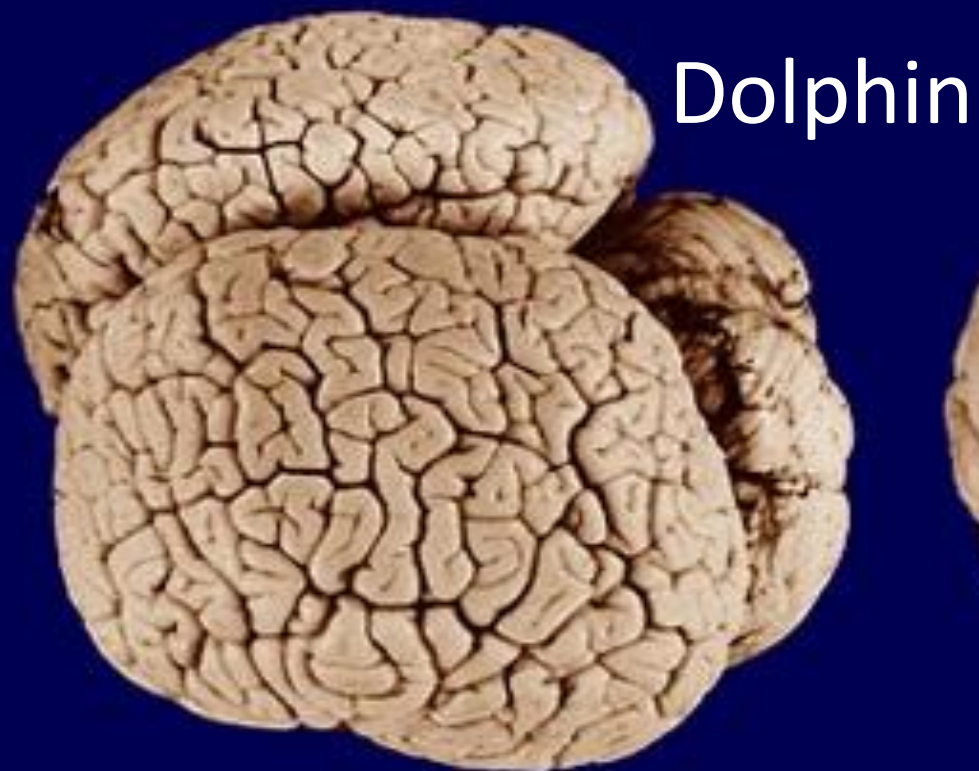


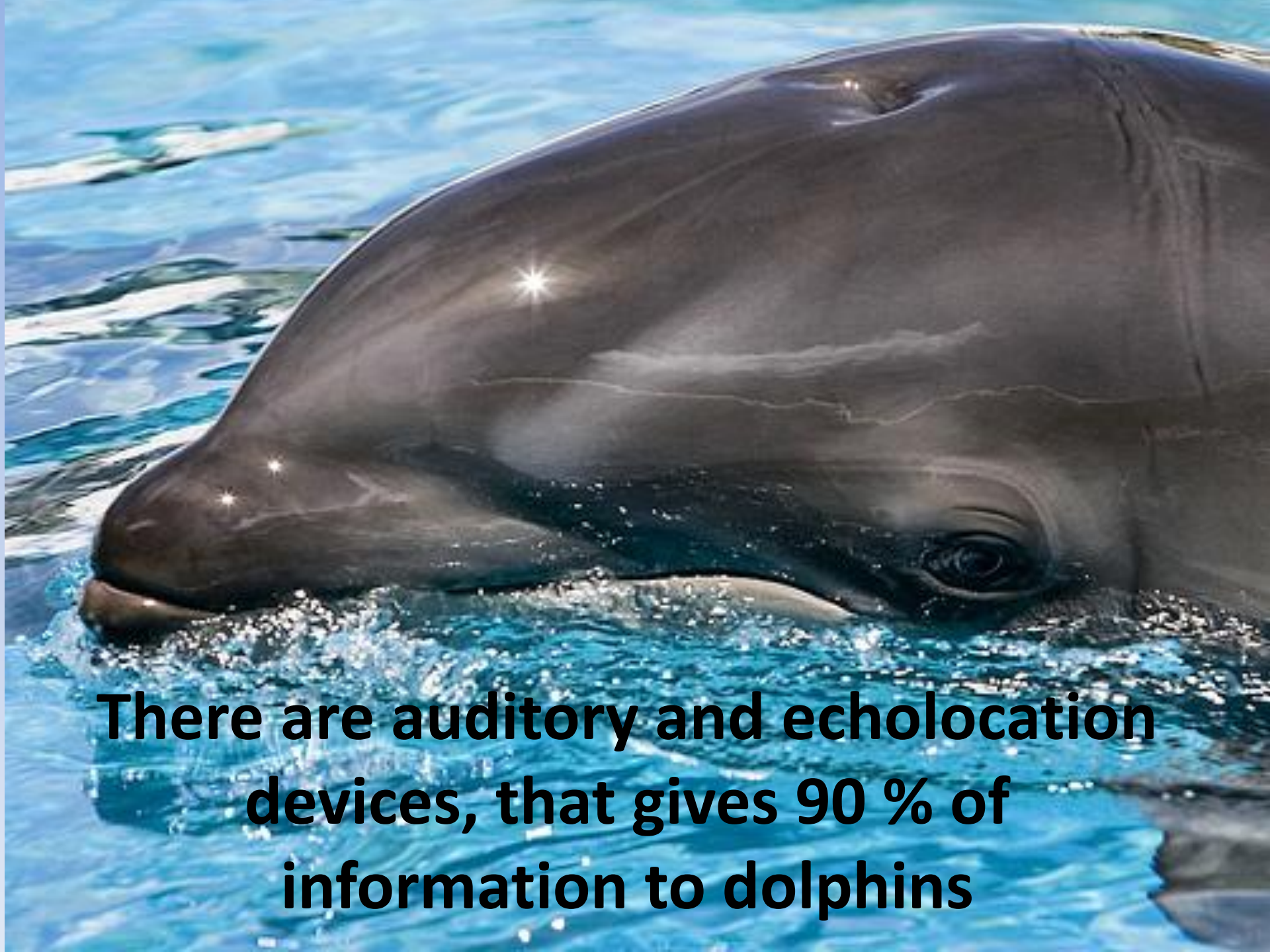
Similarities

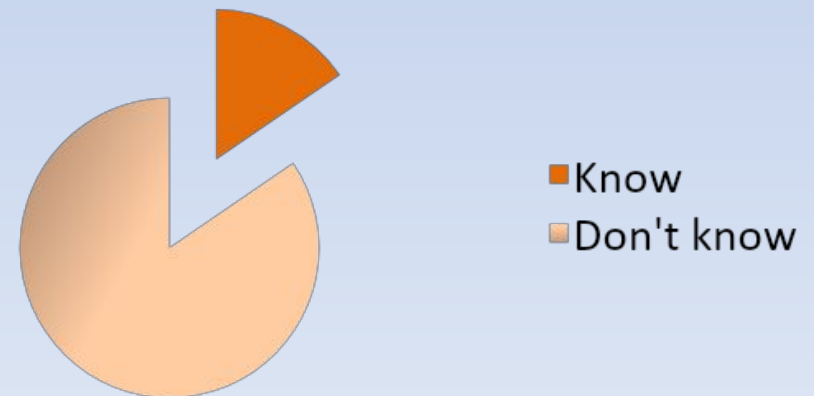

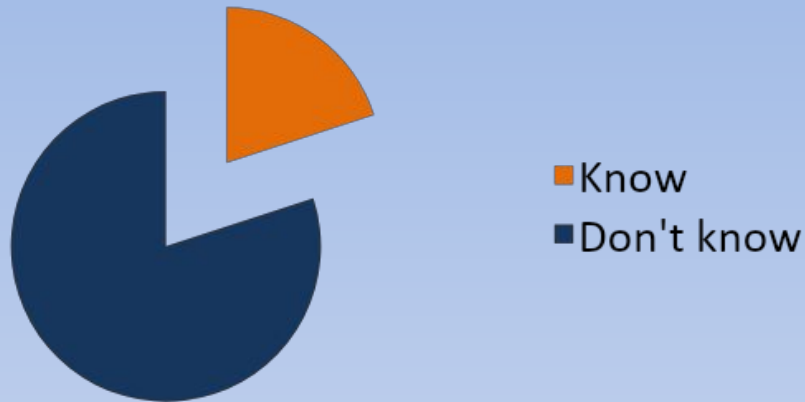

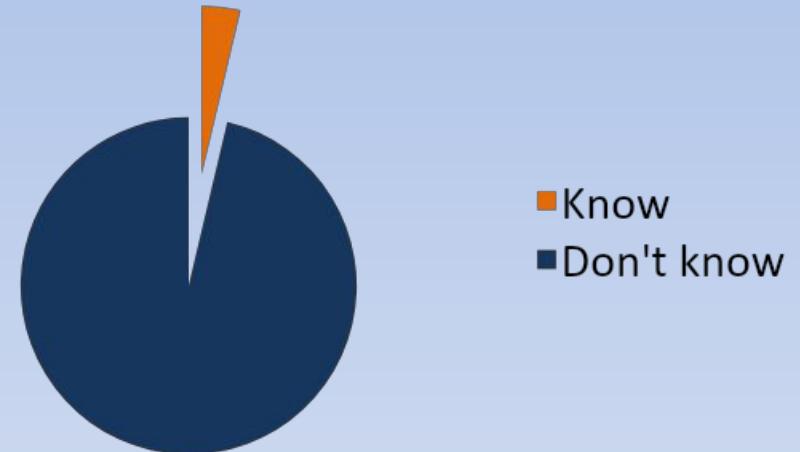
