# WHAT IS AN ADJECTIVE?

A word that modifies a noun.

- There are SIX different kinds of adjectives
- There are THREE degrees of adjectives

# Types of adjectives

- Description
- Limiting
- Pronominal
- Possessive
- Proper

# DESCRIPTIVE ADJECTIVE

Words that describe a noun or a pronoun

- Yellow flowers
- Spacious garden
- Cardboard box
- Heavy weights
- Small animal

## LIMITING ADJECTIVE

- Also called ARTICLES
  - A, AN, THE
  - The book
  - A book
  - An orange
- Numerals are also limiting adjectives
  - One book
  - Third prize
  - Seventh place

## PRONOMINAL ADJECTIVE

- Pronouns that modify a noun
  - Which, what, whatever, whatsoever, whichever, this
  - This reason
  - Which book
  - Whatever reason
  - What mistake

## POSSESSIVE ADJECTIVE

- Pronouns used as adjectives to show ownership
  - My, Your, His, Her, Its, Our, Their
- Her bracelet
- Their team
- His hat

## PROPER ADJECTIVE

- Derived from Proper Nouns
- Japanese students
- American history
- Korean film
- French lessons
- Mexican food
- Ritz crackers

### PREDICATE ADJECTIVE

- Not a modifier of a noun
- Always a complement
- Tom was <u>successful</u>.
- Successful is a complement of the subject
- Successful Tom
- Successful is the predicate adjective

## Comparisons / Degrees of Adjectives

- Positive
- Comparative
- Superlative

#### Positive

- Expresses no comparison
- Only about one noun.

- The room was large.
- □ The box is **brown**.
- The room was long.
- The bear was fuzzy.

#### Comparative

- Compares two persons or things.
- Tom is happier after lunch.
- He is the taller of the two boys.
- Some oranges are more **delicious** during the winter months.
- I was less excited about the barbeque than Jenny.

## SUPERLATIVE

When more than two persons or things are compared.

- This is the warmest room in the house.
- Gloria is the most **beautiful** girl in the world.

### SUMMARY

□ POSITIVE = Good, Bad, Less, Many

COMPARATIVE = Better, Worse, Lesser, More

SUPERLATIVE = Best, Worst, Least, Most
