- People cut horrible faces in pumpkins and put a candle inside, which shines through the eyes.

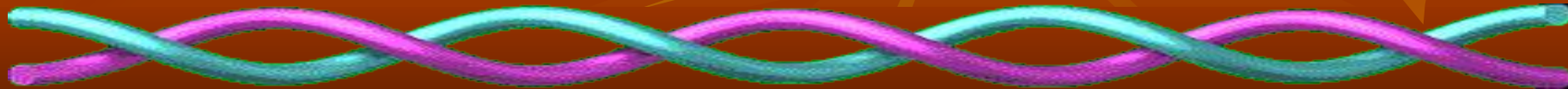
