


Robert Burns

Scottish poet, famous overworld.

He wrote his poems, songs and lyrics chiefly in the Scottish dialect.





His Life

Robert Burns was born on January 25, 1759, in a small clay cottage at Alloway in Ayrshire, Scotland.

His father was a poor farmer.

Burns started writing poems at the age of seventeen.

Though Burns's poems were popular, he always remained poor.

Drinks from 7.30pm, Dinner 8pm


Celebrate the Birthday of Scotland's greatest poet with Haggis, Neeps & Tatties, a dram or two and maybe even some traditional Scottish dancing!
