

Maria Sharapova the leader I admire



Maria Yuryevna Sharapova born April 19, 1987) is a former World No. 1 Russian professional tennis player. In a career marred by serious injury, Sharapova has won 22 WTA singles titles. Since her shoulder injury in 2008, she has not recovered her championship form.






Sharapova was born in <u>1987</u> in the town of *Nyagan' in Siberia*, Russia. Her parents moved from Gomel, Belarus after the Chernobyl nuclear accident in 1986 affected the region. When Sharapova was two, the family moved to <u>Sochi</u> where her father befriended Aleksandr Kafelnikov. Aleksandr gave Sharapova her first tennis racket at the age of four, whereupon she began practicing regularly with her father in a local park. She took her first tennis lessons with veteran Russian coach <u>Yuri</u> <u>Yutkin</u>, who was instantly impressed when he first saw her, noting her "exceptional hand-eye co-ordination."

 At the age of seven, Sharapova attended a tennis clinic in Moscow run by <u>Martina Navrátilová</u>, who recommended professional training at the <u>Nick Bollettieri Tennis</u> <u>Academy</u> in <u>Florida</u>. Yuri and Masha finally travelled to America in <u>1994</u>. Visa restrictions prevented Sharapova's mother from joining them for two years. Arriving in Florida with just \$700 to his name, Sharapova's father took various low-paying jobs to fund her lessons until she was old enough to be admitted to the academy.



- Sharapova made her professional breakthrough in 2004.
- Seeded <u>13th</u> and aged <u>17</u> at *<u>Wimbledon</u>*, she reached her first Grand Slam semifinal by defeating <u>Ai Sugiyama</u>. There, she came back from a 6–2, 3–1 deficit to defeat fifth seed and former champion *Lindsay Davenport*. In the final, Sharapova upset top seed and defending champion *Serena* **<u>Williams.</u>** to win her first Grand Slam singles title, and become the third youngest woman to win the Wimbledon title. Sharapova also became the second Russian woman to win a grand slam singles title..



The victory was hailed as "the most stunning upset in memory", with other writers commenting on her arrival as a serious challenger to the Williams' dominance at Wimbledon. She entered the top ten in the rankings for the first time as a result of the win. Following her Wimbledon win, attention and interest in Sharapova in the media greatly increased, a rise in popularity dubbed as "Maria

Mania."




She ultimately won her second major at the <u>2006 US Open</u> defeating then-World No. 1 <u>Amélie Mauresmo</u> in the semifinals and World No. 2 <u>Justine Henin</u> in the final.



Sharapova was seeded fifth at the <u>Australian Open 2008</u>, but was not considered a favorite. Nevertheless, she defeated former World No. 1 <u>Lindsay</u> <u>Davenport</u> in the second round, and then World No. 1 <u>Henin</u> in the quarterfinals. Proceeded to the finals, where she defeated <u>Ana Ivanović</u> to win her <u>third Grand Slam</u> <u>title</u>, having not dropped a set all tournament.

After reclaiming the number one ranking in May 2008, Sharapova's *shoulder* problems re-surfaced, ultimately requiring surgery in October and forcing her out of the game for nearly ten months. Sharapova returned in <u>May 2009</u> and was ranked <u>No. 126</u> in the world due to her extensive lay-off. Since her comeback, Sharapova has won <u>3 singles</u> titles (bringing her career total to 22) and improved her ranking.

- Sharapova's public profile extends beyond tennis, as she has been featured in a number of modeling assignments. Also she has been featured in many advertisements and has been the face of many *fashion houses*, primarily <u>Cole Haan</u>. Since February 2007, she has been a **United Nations Development** <u>Project Goodwill</u>, concerned specifically with the <u>Chernobyl</u> <u>Recovery and Development</u> <u>Programme</u>.
- Sharapova became engaged to her boyfriend, NBA basketball player <u>Sasha Vujačić</u>, after they had been dating for nearly a year.
