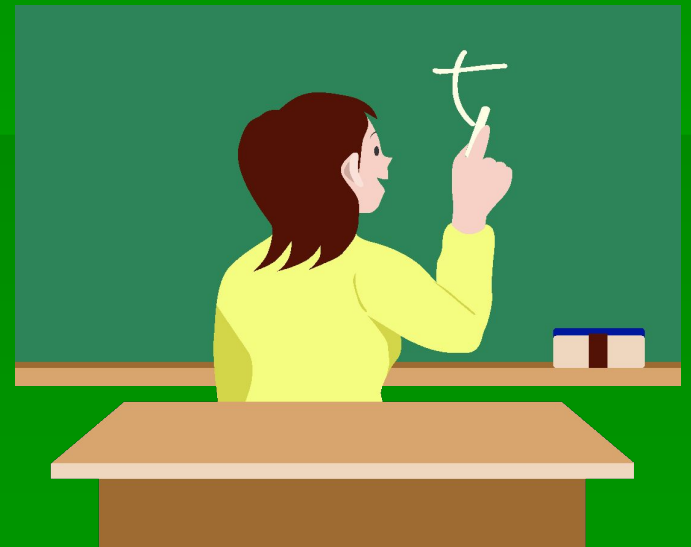

Conditional Sentences

- express possible or desired action.

First Conditional.

Type of the conditional sentence	What kind of possibility expresses?	Formula
First Conditional	- expresses real possibility related to future .	If ...(Present Simple), I ... (Future Simple).

First Conditional

E.g.: - I think I left my watch at your house.

– Ok, if I find it, I shall tell you.

Second Conditional.

Type of the conditional sentence	What kind of possibility expresses?	Formula
Second Conditional	expresses unreal or imagined action related to present or future .	If ...(Past Simple), I ... (Future-in-the-past).

Second Conditional

E.g.: If I knew his number, I would call him.

*(but the real situation is that she doesn't know his number **now**).*

E.g.: If I were you, I wouldn't do it.

*(**were** is used for all person).*

Third Conditional.

Type of the conditional sentence	What kind of possibility expresses?	Formula
Third Conditional	expresses unreal possibility related to the past .	If ...(Past Perfect), I ... (Future Perfect-in-the-past).

Third conditional

*E.g.: If I had known you were in hospital,
I would have gone to visit you.*

(The real situation **was** that he **didn't know** that he was in hospital).
