






At present the British royal family is headed by **Queen Elizabeth** The marriage of the Princess Elizabeth to Philip, Duke of Edinburgh took place in November 1947.



The Queen's husband **Philip**, Duke of Edinburgh, was born in 1926 and served in the Royal Navy. He takes a great deal of interest in industry, in the achievements of young people (he founded Duke of Edinburgh's Award Scheme in 1956) and in saving raise wild animals from extinction.

Windsor Castle is an official residence of The Queen and the largest occupied castle in the world. The Queen uses the Castle both as a private home, where she usually spends the weekend, and as a Royal residence at which she undertakes certain formal duties. Every year The Queen takes up official residence in Windsor Castle ford a month over Easter (March-April).



- Each year all the knights meet at Windsor on a Monday in June. Then they walk from the Castle to St George's Chapel where a special ceremony takes place
