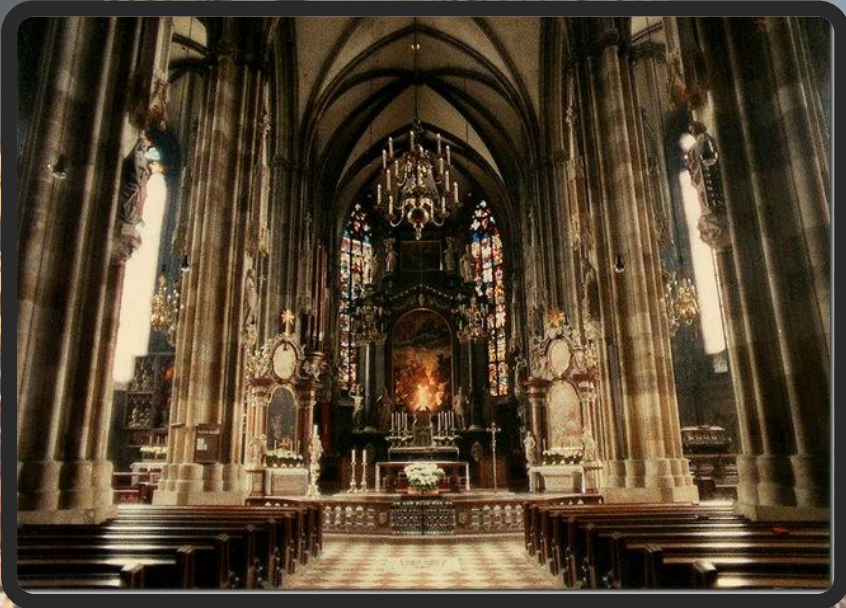
The English name Vienna is borrowed from the Italian, "Vienna" and the official German name Wien, and the names of the city in most

In Slovene, the city is called *Dunaj*, which in other Slavic languages means the Danube River, on which it is located.



Symbol of Vienna

St. Stephen's Cathedral or Stephansdom - Catholic cathedral, the national symbol of Austria and the symbol of the city of Vienna.



The highest part of St. Stephen's Cathedral - South Tower. During the time of the Habsburgs, no church of Austria-Hungary could not be higher than the south tower of St. Stephen. There is an observation deck, which offers a magnificent view over the Danube and Vienna.

The roof of St. Stephen's Cathedral is covered multicolor tiles, which are laid in the same arms of the Republic of Austria.



Near the main portal in "Romanesque wall" is Chair of St. John of Capistrano, which in 1454 he called for a crusade against turok.V interior of St. Stephen's Cathedral is a lot of sculpture samples XIV-XV centuries.

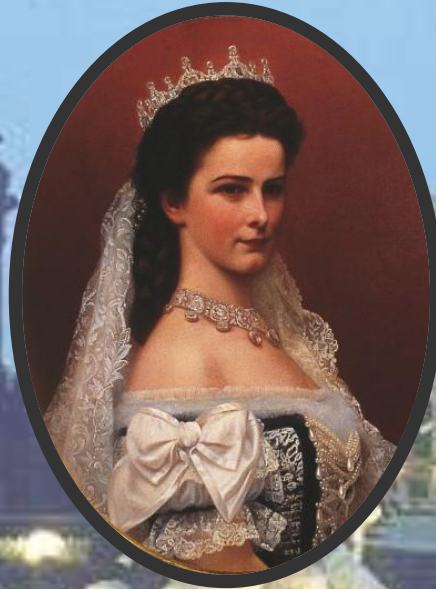

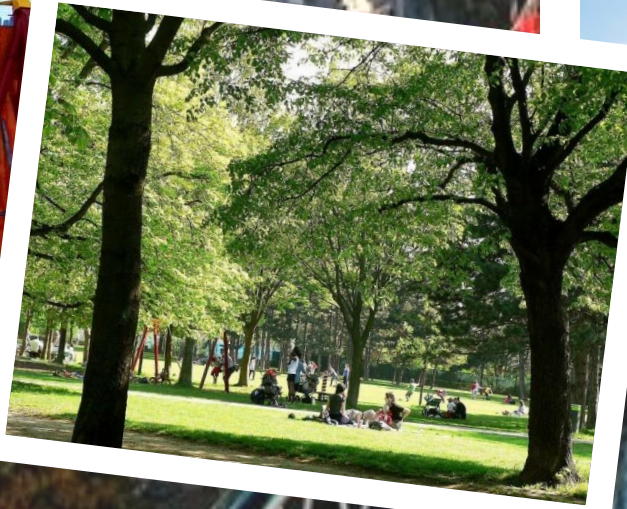




Landmarks

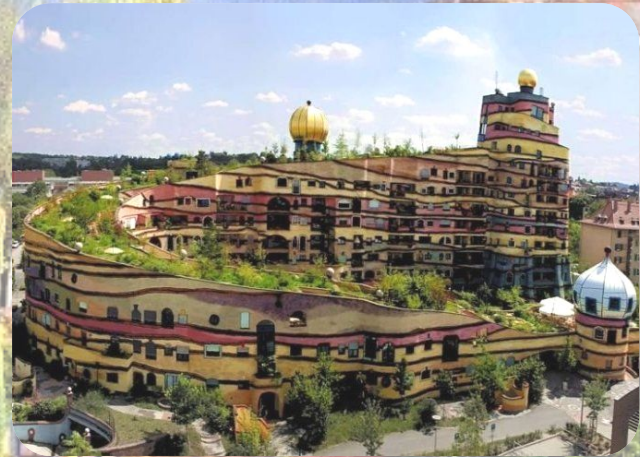
Staatsoper
