Данный урок способствует развитию у учащихся развития навыков говорения.



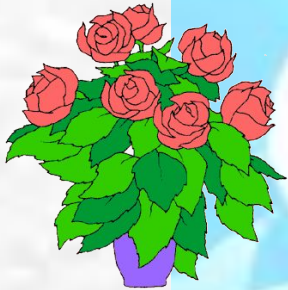

- New Year's Day is a family event in Russia. People begin to prepare for this holiday beforehand. People decorate their New Year trees with tinsel, various baubles and colored lights. They usually put their presents under the tree. When the Kremlin clock strikes 12 they see the New Year in.



New Year's Day in England



- On the 1st of January people do not go to bed until after midnight on December 31. They like to [see the old year out](#) and the new year in. New Year is not so popular in England as in our country, [although](#) it is [rather](#) popular in Scotland. On that day people usually visit their friends and there is a lot of dancing and eating. In Scotland people bring a piece of [coal](#) for good luck in the New Year.

Women's Day in Russia



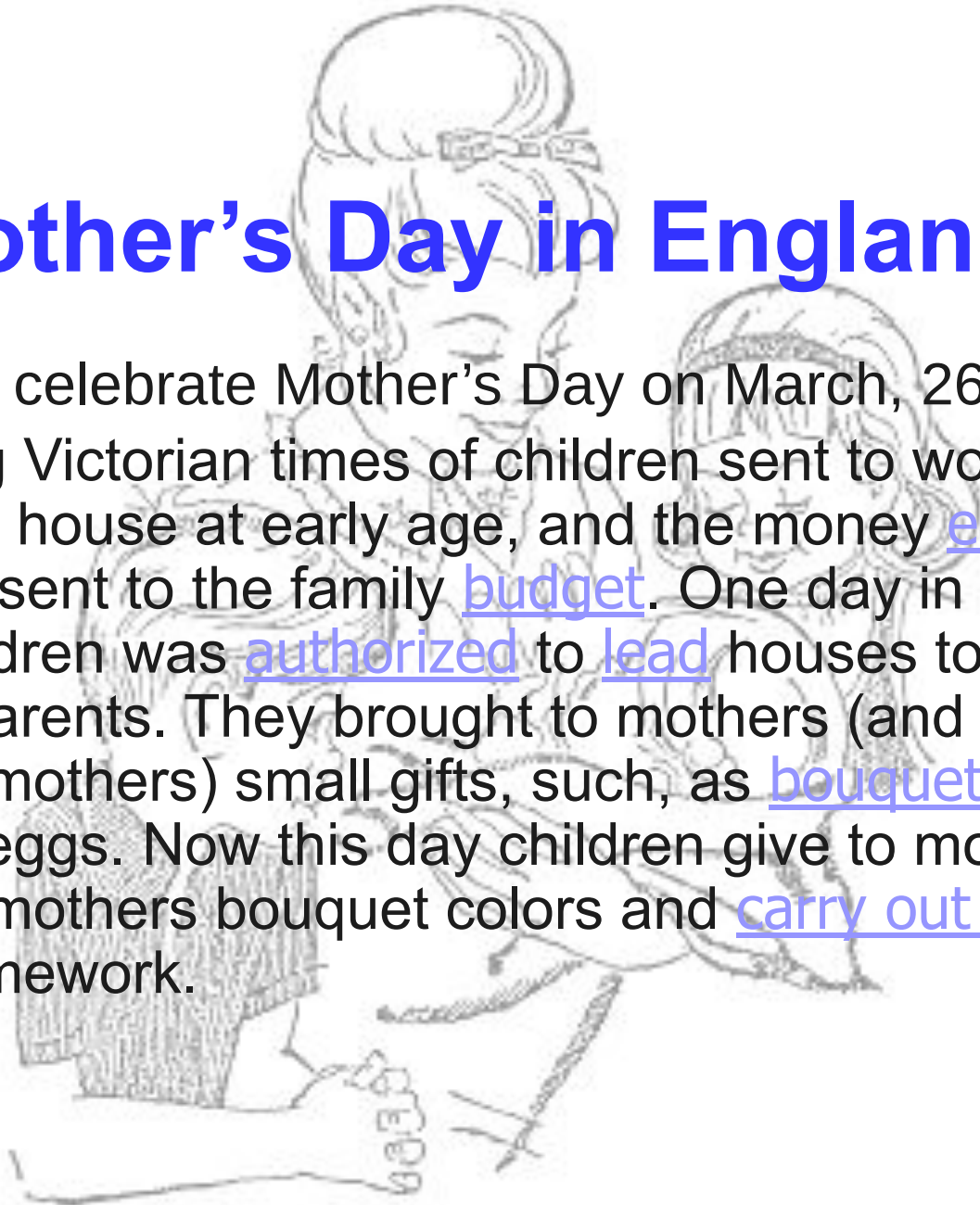

Now this day children give to mothers and grandmothers bouquet colors and carry out for them all homework.

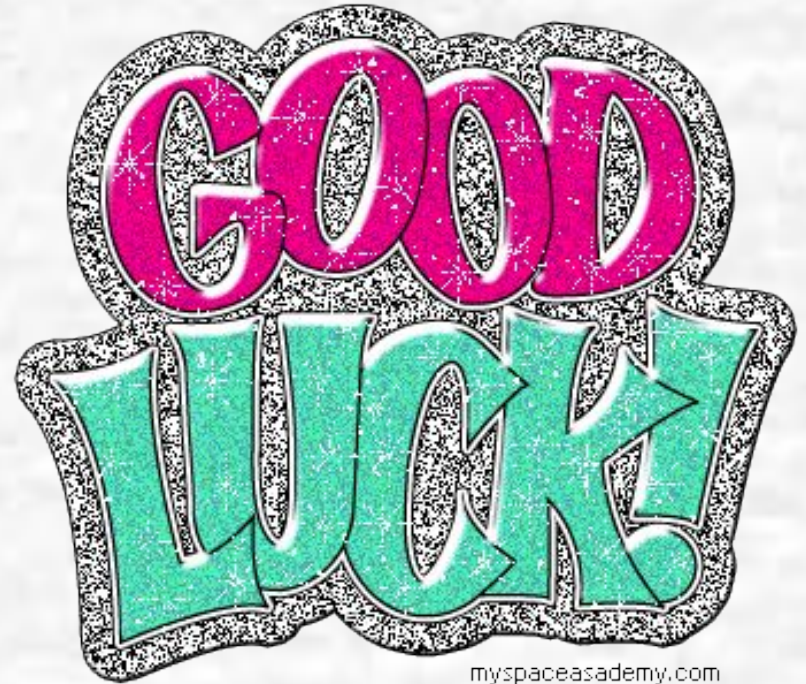
- What are the similarities between holidays in Russia and England?
