- 5. This room is not very large. People take off their overcoats, hats, boots or shoes there. There is usually a mirror and a little table there.**

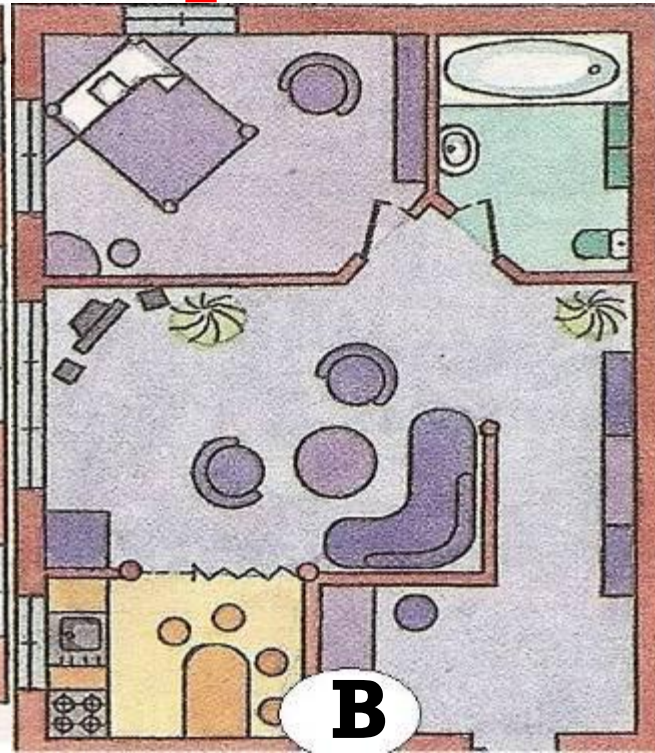
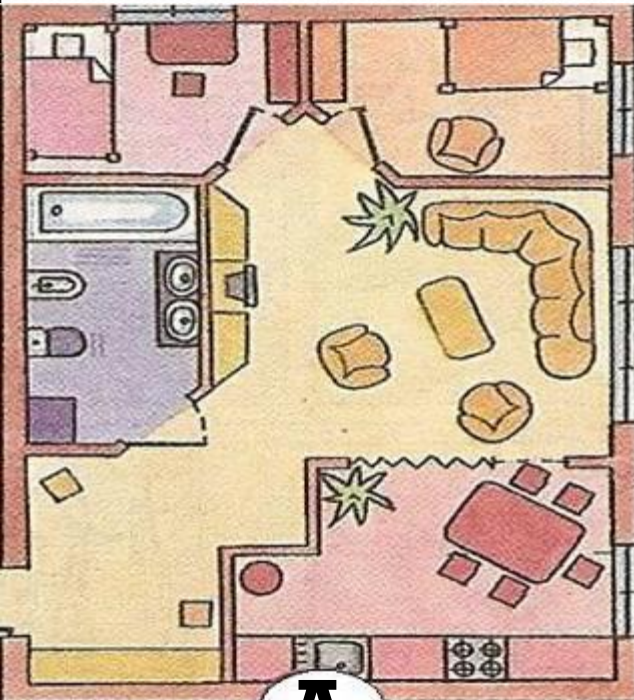
