







President of the House of Commons is the Speaker. He is elected from among the oldest and most respected of its members at the beginning of the new parliament, or upon an appropriate vacancy.

Speaker 's candidacy should be coordinated leaders of political parties represented in the House, and approved by the monarch. If the speaker remembers the MP after the next parliamentary elections, the deputies re-elected him for another term



The main task of the speaker is , first, to the interoperability of the monarch of the House of Commons , the government and other institutions of government , and second - in the implementation of organizational leadership Chamber.



☐ Thus, the speaker determines the order of the MPs and sees to it that they spoke on the merits, controls the course of the debate, and apply disciplinary measures against violators of the order, select a committee that will work on the draft law, and appoints its chairman, determines whether the bill to number of financial and decides to hold a meeting of the Committee of the whole House, confirms overcoming the veto of the House of Lords, etc. Thus , the speaker plays an important role in the work of Parliament.

Thus, the speaker plays an important role in the work of Parliament. With this in mind, and in order to prevent the benefits of the party to which the speaker, immediately after the election he formally leaves its composition. To prevent pressure on the Speaker to MPs during the debate, he, like his deputies are not afforded the right to speak at meetings of the Chamber and participate in the voting. The exception is when the deputies' votes are equally divided.
