Conditional Sentences





Today is rainy
and I don't
go for a walk.



Maybe it *will* be
sunny
tomorrow and
I *will* go for a
walk.



If it *is* sunny tomorrow, I *will* go
for a walk.



The first conditional is a structure used for talking about possibilities in the present or in the future.

If/when + Present Simple



will



If Mary maries me I...



I am a
teacher.

I am not a
cosmonaut.




If I **were** a cosmonaut, I **would**
go to the moon.




The second conditional is a structure used for talking about unreal situations in the present or in the future.

If /when + Past Simple
→ would
