

# Shops / stores

- a market (street market, supermarket)
- a shopping precinct
- a shopping centre
- a(shopping) mall
- a store (a shoe/clothing/grocery etc store, a department store)

The methods of shopping may vary. It may be a self-service shop where the customer goes from counter to counter selecting and putting into a basket what he wishes to buy. Then he takes the basket to the check-out counter, where the prices of the purchases are added up. If it is not a self-service shop, the shop-assistant helps the <u>customer</u> in finding what he wants. You pay money to the cashier and he gives you back the change.


