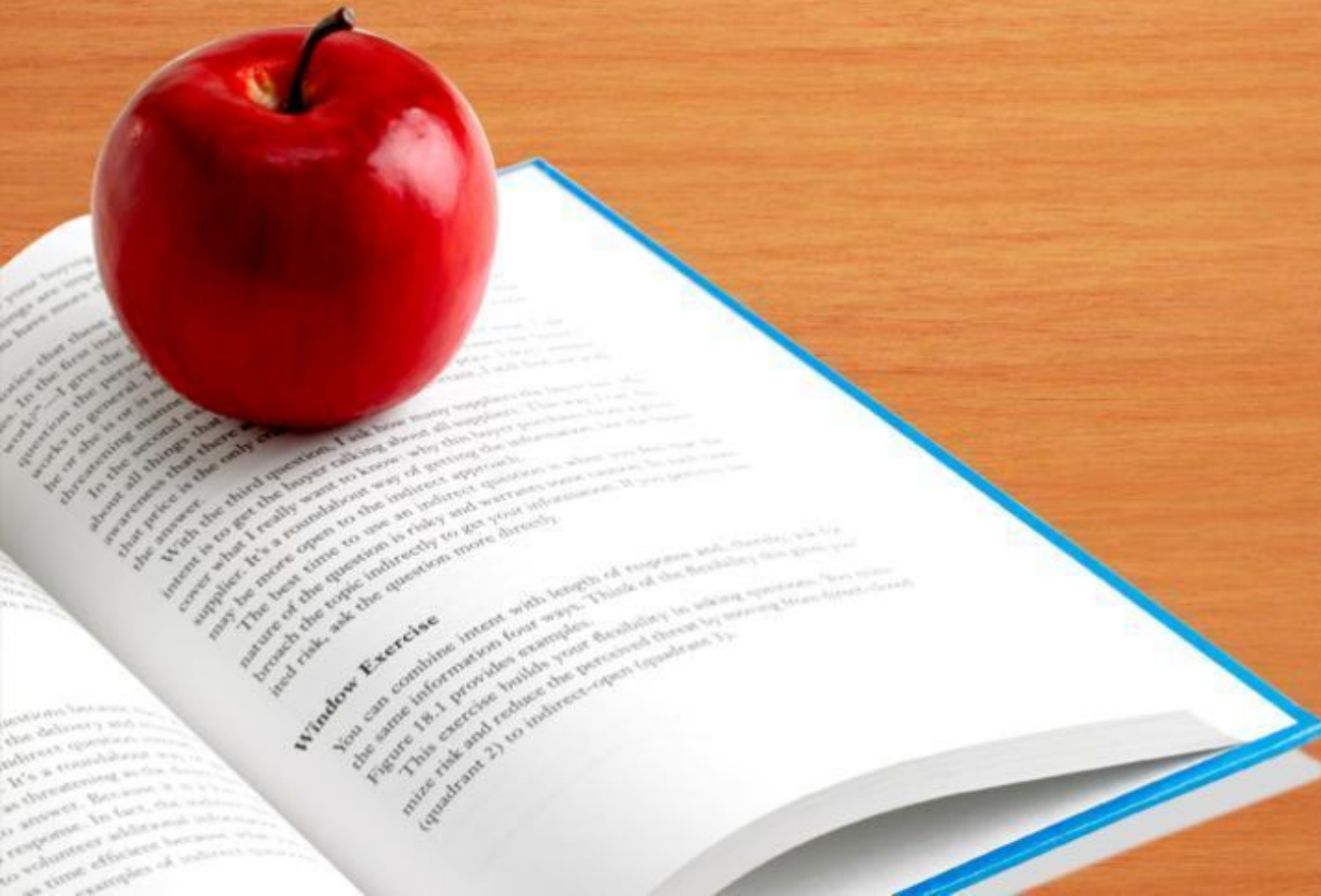

1. Future plans, arrangements, appointments.

Settled plans at a specific time and place.

The arrangements have already been made.

Ex: We are getting married next month. (the wedding has already been arranged).

Intentions decided at the time of speaking .

Ex: Come on, I'll help you with those bags. (seeing that someone is struggling with their shopping bags).

Intentions that have already been decided before the time of speaking but have not been fully planned.

Ex: We 're going to get married. (referring to a past decision).

An official arrangement.

Ex: The German Chancellor is to visit France.

		<p><i>Predictions that are based on personal judgment, opinion or intuition.</i></p> <p><i>Ex:</i> I think you will find this book interesting. (opinion)</p> <p><u>! Often after:</u></p> <p>I think I believe I suppose In my opinion Probably May be</p>	<p><i>Predictions that are based on present evidence.</i></p> <p><i>Ex:</i> My sister is going to have a baby. (you can see that she is pregnant).</p>
