THE FIRST MAN-MADE SATELLITE IN SPACE WAS CALLED SPUTNIK.



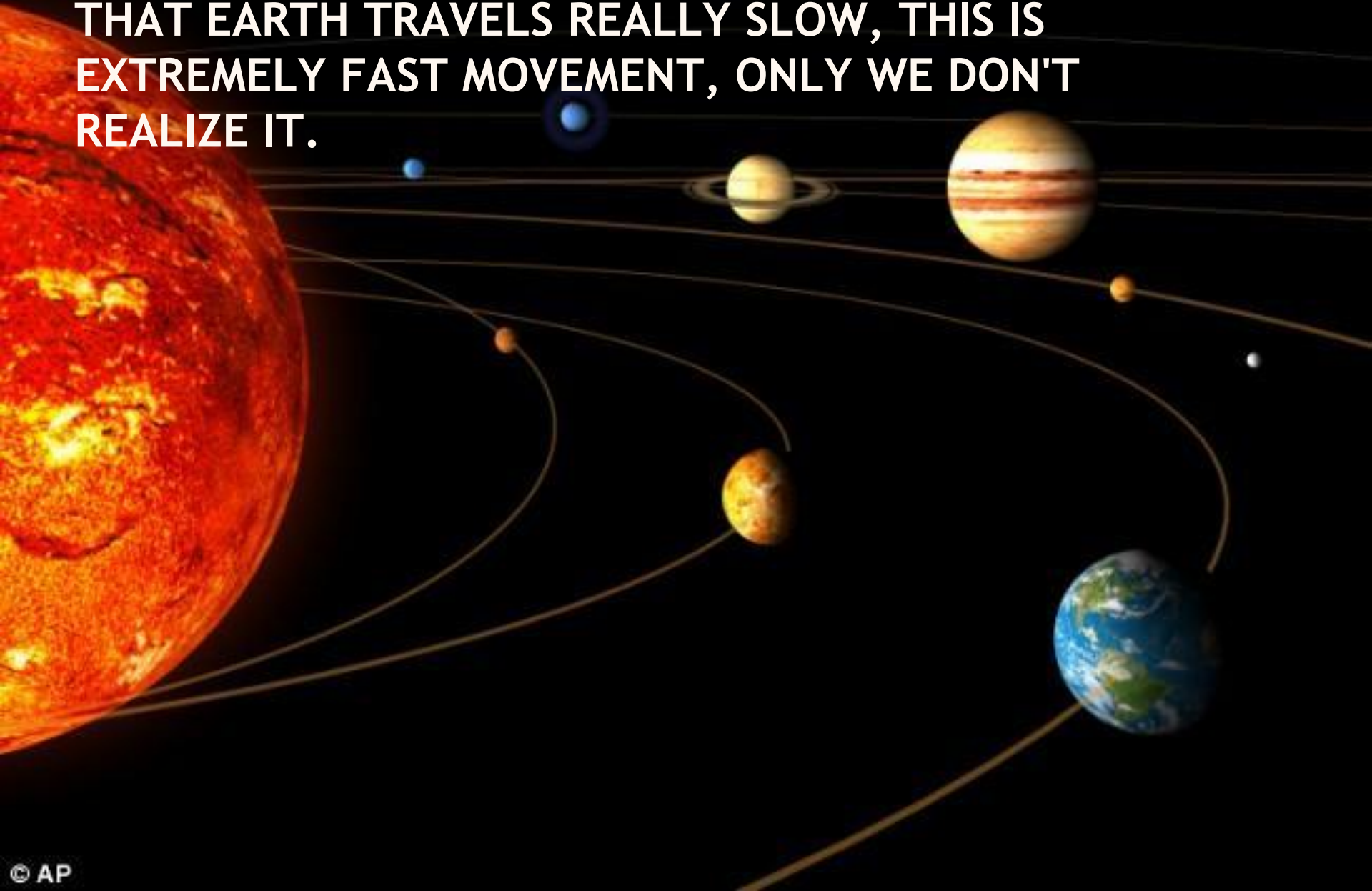
MERCURY, VENUS, EARTH AND MARS ARE CALLED THE INNER PLANETS AS THEY ARE CLOSEST TO THE SUN!

JUPITER'S MOON EUROPA IS COMPLETELY COVERED WITH ICE.



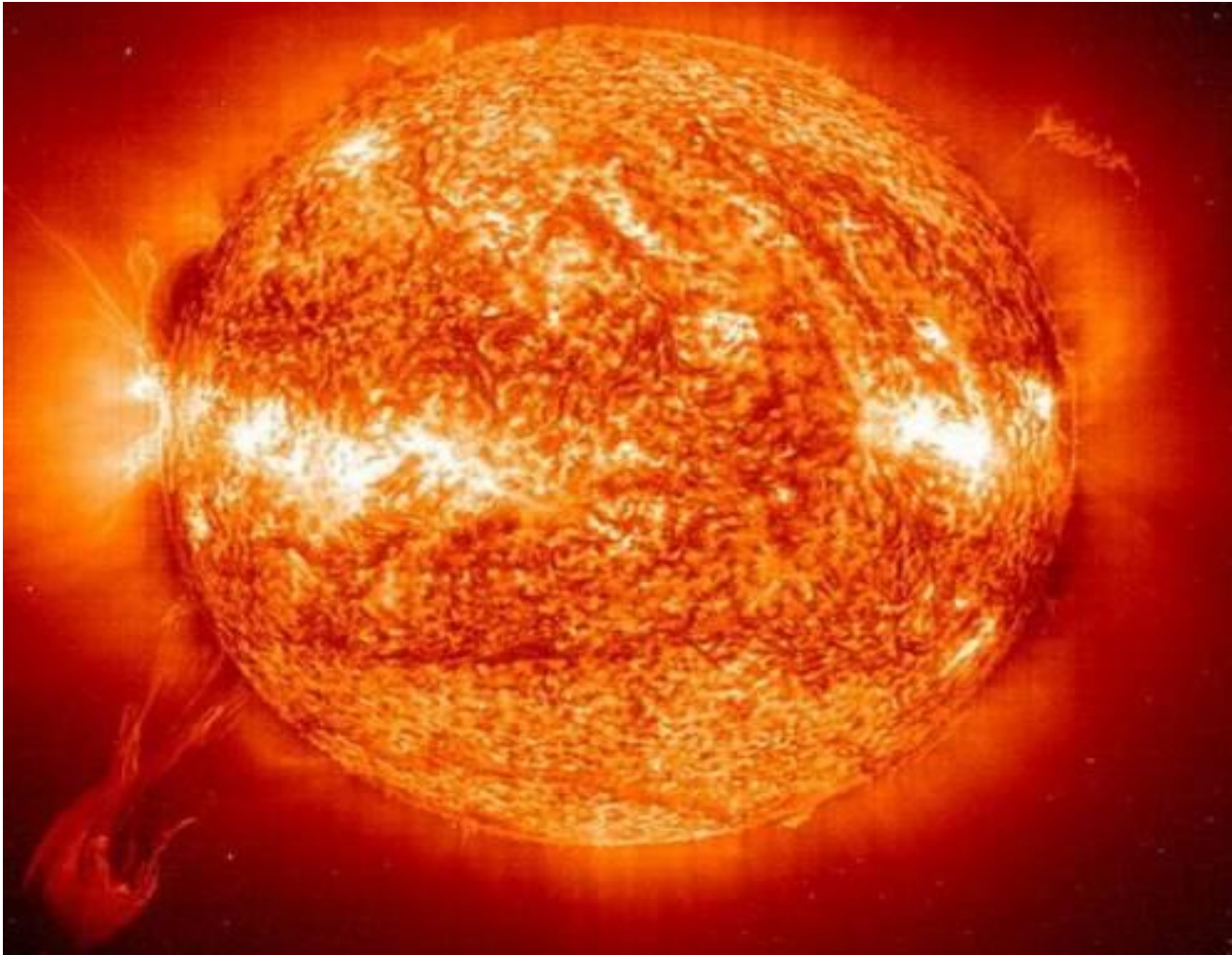
MERCURY AND VENUS HAVE NO MOONS.

THEIR OWN MOON.**



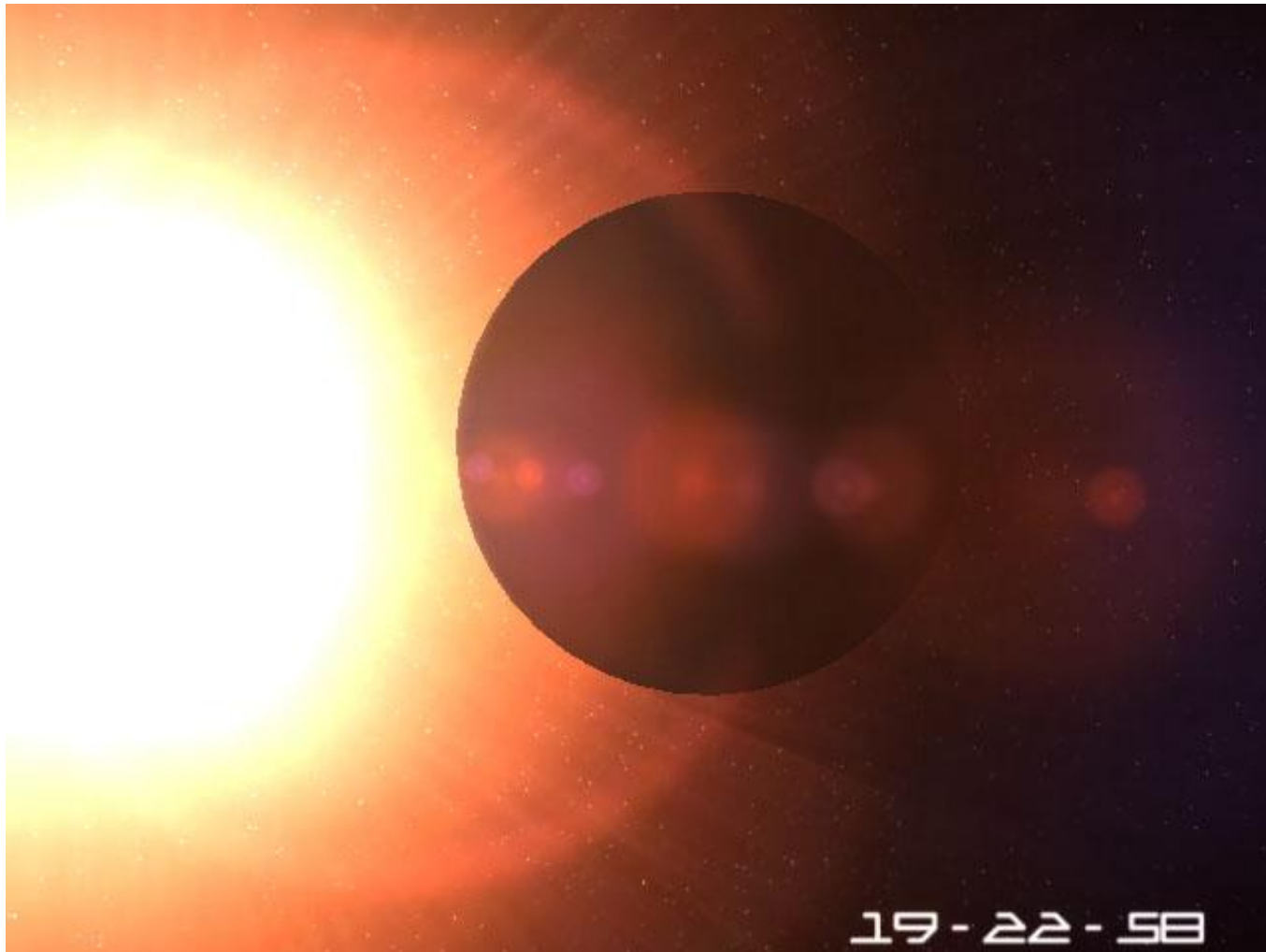
SURFACE TEMPERATURE OF SUN IS ABOUT

FAHRENHEIT).

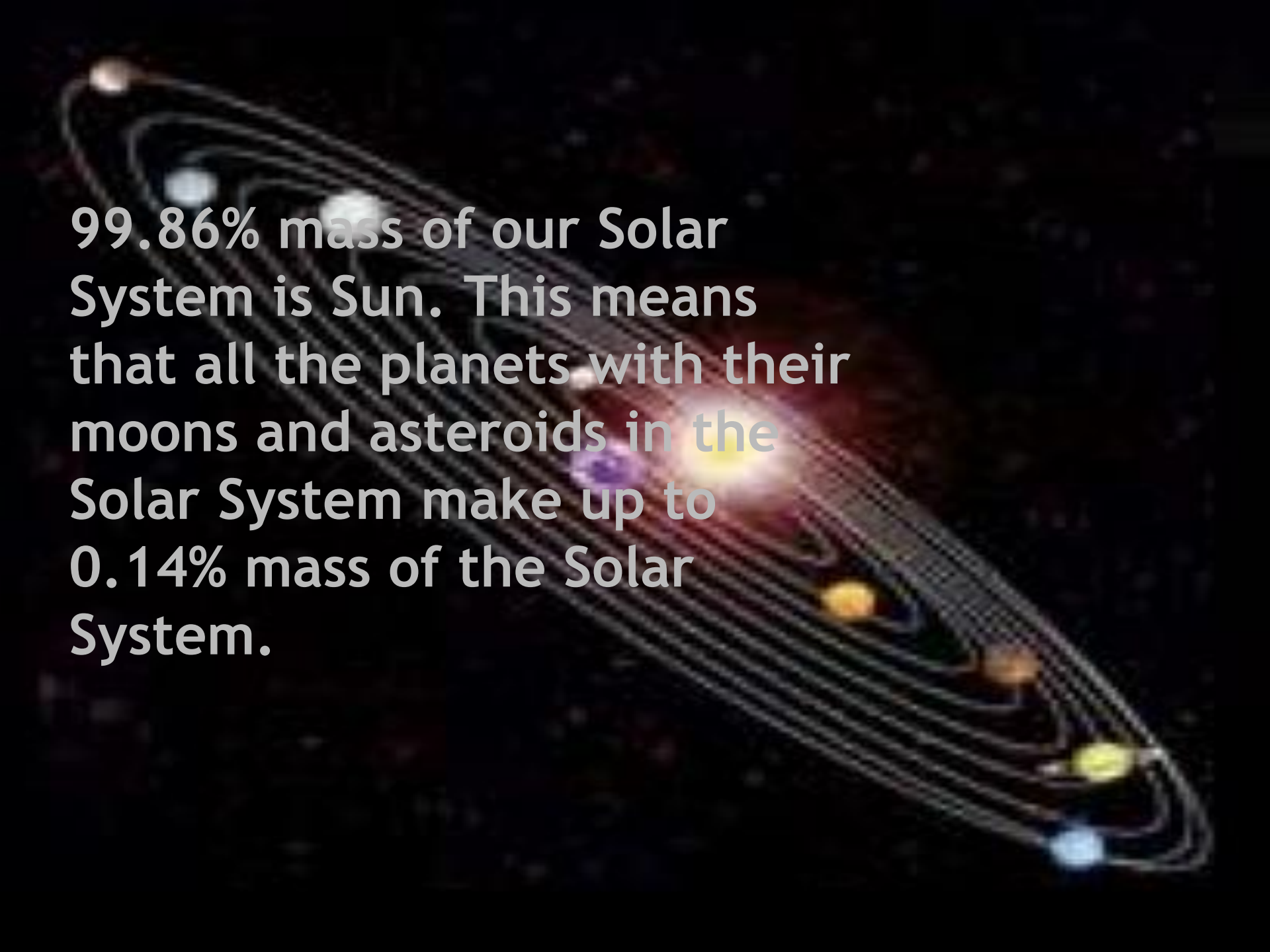


**MOON IS MOVING

MERCURY HAS NO ATMOSPHERE.
