YEARS OF LIFE 1832—1898

He was born on January 27, 1832 in the village of Dursbury, Cheshire county in the family of the priest. There were 7 girls and 4 boys in the family.



He began to study at home, showed himself as clever and intelligent boy. He was left-handed, according to unconfirmed reports, he was forbidden to write with his left hand. It brought him suffering.

He did not study well, but thanks to the outstanding mathematical abilities after receiving a bachelor's degree won the competition for reading mathematical lectures in Christ Church. He was giving these lectures for 26 years, they made a good income, even though he was boring of it.
