7 May 1908



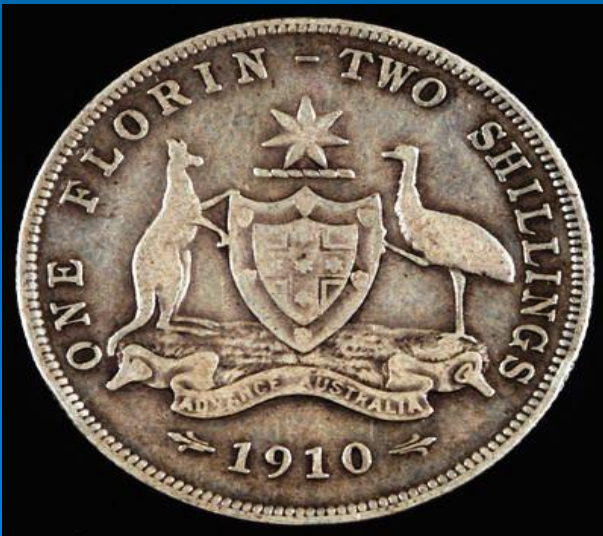
Initial Coat of Arms

- used on some Australian coins
- last appeared on the sixpenny piece in 1966

the current version
was granted
by King George V
(3 June 1865 –
20 January 1936)
19 September 1912

Why a new one?

no specific references to the
states

alterations

approved



a new design:

six badge of states

What is in?

□ a shield: the badges of the six Australian states

+

□ enclosed by an *ermine border*

□ a symbol for the federation of the states, which took place in 1901



What is in?

- the crest (helmet on a coat of arms)
- a seven-pointed gold star on a blue and gold wreath.
- Six of the points represent each of the states of the Commonwealth; the seventh point represents Australia's territories

- the motto 'Advance Australia'
- before the federation of the states in 1901, popularly accepted due to the song 'Advance Australia Fair'  Australia's national anthem in 1984
