

Buckingham Palace





World-famous Buckingham Palace is the official London residence of the Queen - Her Majesty Queen Elizabeth II. But it is not just the main palace of the country, not only the location of the Queen, which has been for more than forty years, she acts as the head of state and the British Commonwealth, the supreme chief of the armed forces and the secular head of the Anglican Church. Buckingham Palace has 775 rooms. These include 19 State rooms, 52 Royal and guest bedrooms, 188 staff bedrooms, 92 offices and 78 bathrooms. In measurements, the building is 108 metres long across the front, 120 metres deep (including the central quadrangle) and 24 metres high.

The Palace is very much a working building and the centrepiece of Britain's constitutional monarchy. It houses the offices of those who support the day-to-day activities and duties of The Queen and The Duke of Edinburgh and their immediate family.
