# Words - helpers

PRESENT	<b>usually</b> <b>every</b> (day, year, ...) <b>at 5 o' clock</b> <b>in the morning...</b> <b>often</b> <b>never</b>	<b>now</b> <b>at the moment</b> <b>it's 6 o'clock</b> <b>Look!</b> <b>Listen!</b>	<b>just</b> <b>already</b> <b>ever</b> <b>never</b> <b>yet</b>	<b>since 1999</b>  <b>for (2 hours)</b>
PAST	<b>yesterday</b> <b>(2 days) ago</b> <b>last (month)</b> <b>in 1999</b>	<b>at 5 o'clock</b> <b>yesterday</b>  <b>while</b>  <b>when (he came)</b>	<b>by 5 o'clock</b>  <b>when (he came)</b>	<b>by 5 o'clock</b>  <b>for (2 hours)</b>
FUTURE	<b>tomorrow</b> <b>next (day, week)</b> <b>the following (day)</b> <b>in (2 days)</b> <b>in 2050</b>	<b>at 5 o'clock</b> <b>tomorrow</b>  <b>when (you come)</b>	<b>by 5 o'clock</b> <b>when (you come)</b>	<b>by 5 o'clock</b>  <b>for (2 hours)</b>

PAST	<b>was</b> <b>were</b> <div>V<sub>3</sub> (<i>ed</i>)</div>	<b>was</b> <b>were</b> <div>being V<sub>3</sub> (<i>ed</i>)</div>	<b>had</b> <div>been V<sub>3</sub> (<i>ed</i>)</div>
FUTURE	<b>shall</b> <b>will</b> <div>be V<sub>3</sub> (<i>ed</i>)</div>	<div></div>	<b>shall</b> <b>will</b> <div>have been V<sub>3</sub> (<i>ed</i>)</div>
