# THE TO- INFINITIVE IS USED

✓ to express purpose

Sam went to the bank to get some money.

✓ after verbs agree, appear, decide, expect, promise, hope, plan etc.

He promised to help us with our decorations.



# THE TO- INFINITIVE IS USED

✓ after adj.

- a. happy, glad, etc
- b. willing, eager, reluctant, etc.
- c. mean, clever, etc.
- d. lucky and fortunate

*I was annoyed to hear that he had left.*

*He is reluctant to help.*



# THE TO- INFINITIVE IS USED

- ✓ after smth., somewhere, anyone, nothing, etc.

We've got a lot of homework to do.

Take something to drink on the bus.

- ✓ after verbs ask, learn, wonder, decided, etc. when they're followed by who, what, where, how, except why.

He explained how to operate the machine.



# THE BARE INFINITIVE IS USED

✓ after modal verbs.

He should apologise to his parents.

✓ after the verbs let, make, see hear and feel

They saw her talk to the manager.





# THE BARE INFINITIVE IS USED

✓ after had better and would rather.

*You had better see a doctor.*
