The first cinema show

The history of cinema begins in the 19th century. The first inventors of cinema were Frenchmen, the brothers Louis and Auguste Lumiere. The first cinema show was on December 28, 1895. In his sessions Lumiere showed a few short (only 50 sec.) rolls first of which was "way out workers the factory". But the most popular of these commercials was spot called "Arrival of a Train"



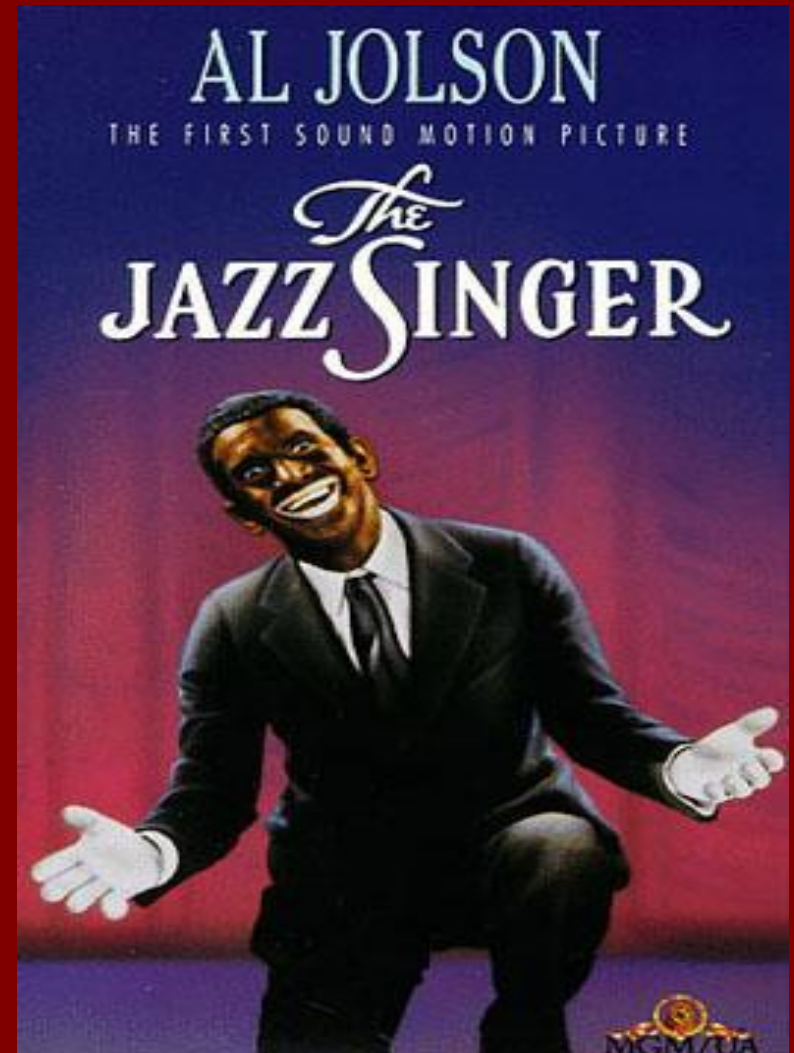
The first long film

In 1910, 70% of films are still made in France. But, other countries, first of all, USA, UK, Germany, are also beginning to make cinema. At the beginning of the century the typical duration of the film was 15 minutes, by 1910 there is a lot of films with a duration about an hour, and in 1915, American Griffith film "Birth of a Nation" (on U.S. Civil War), the duration - for as much as 3 hours.



The first sound film

In the 1920s, the U.S. is beginning to take shape film industry. Prior to 1927 all films were "dumb", they contain only images, no sound. In the early 1920s, there is first a system that can record and play sound film. The first experiment addressed to the American company "Warner Brothers", in 1927, she released the first film in which a character on the screen talking - "The Jazz Singer."



The first color film

- The introduction of color film was slower than the introduction of sound. the possibility of creating color film appeared in the 30s, and in 1939 USA was filmed one of the first color film, which won huge popularity - "Gone With the Wind".



Now

- Then the film industry began to rapidly improve. Began to appear movies with good quality, now removed a lot of films, blockbusters, cartoons.
