


- The internet provides day by day, hour by hour and sometimes up to the minute what is happening worldwide

The internet provides great Variety:

- By topic
- By addressee
- By media type



Variety? Yes!!!

- topics: Literature, Sciences, Economics, etc.
- addressees: For children, for laymen,
 - for scholars
 - By media type: Written texts, audio, video, multimedia
 - Important is what YOU choose !!!

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What is available?


2) TOOLS
